Criminal Justice System News

Adult Incarceration: Bookings remained steady in September (10,833) compared to August (10,823). However, the average daily population rose over 10,000 for the first time ever. The ALOS was nearly unchanged.

The ALOS for agency holds fell from 71.1 days to 70.3 days, while all other populations saw an increase. Pretrial felony ALOS increased the most dramatically, from 9.1 days in August to 12.9 days in September. Pretrial misdemeanor went up slightly from 3.66 days to 3.67 days, with sentenced going from 32.5 days to 32.6 days.

Filings & Case Processing: September Superior Court filings (3,283) decreased from August's 3,704. However, first quarter filings in FY06 are up 24% compared to the same period in FY05. Terminations decreased August to September. The active pending case inventory continued its rise, from 11,057 to 11,265. Arraigned cases also increased from 8,922 to 9,082. Filings into the both the RCC and EDC decreased between August and September. RCC filings went from 2,130 to 1,905, while EDC/Direct Complaints went from 1,178 to 978.

Adult Probation:

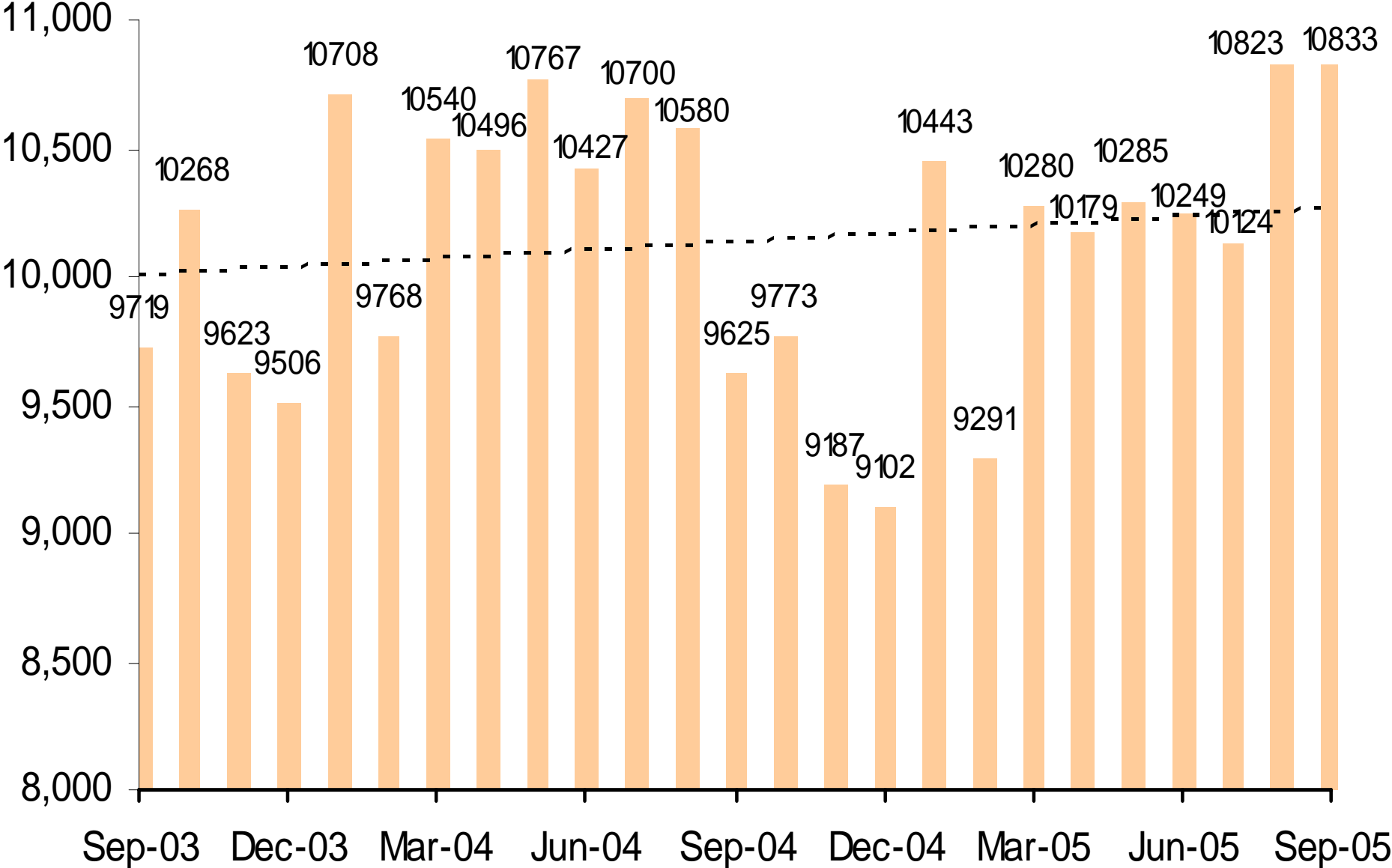

Levels of standard and intensive probation supervision remained relatively unchanged from August to September. Standard probation increased slightly from 27,021 to 27,044, while intensive probation supervision decreased slightly from 1,367 to 1,330.

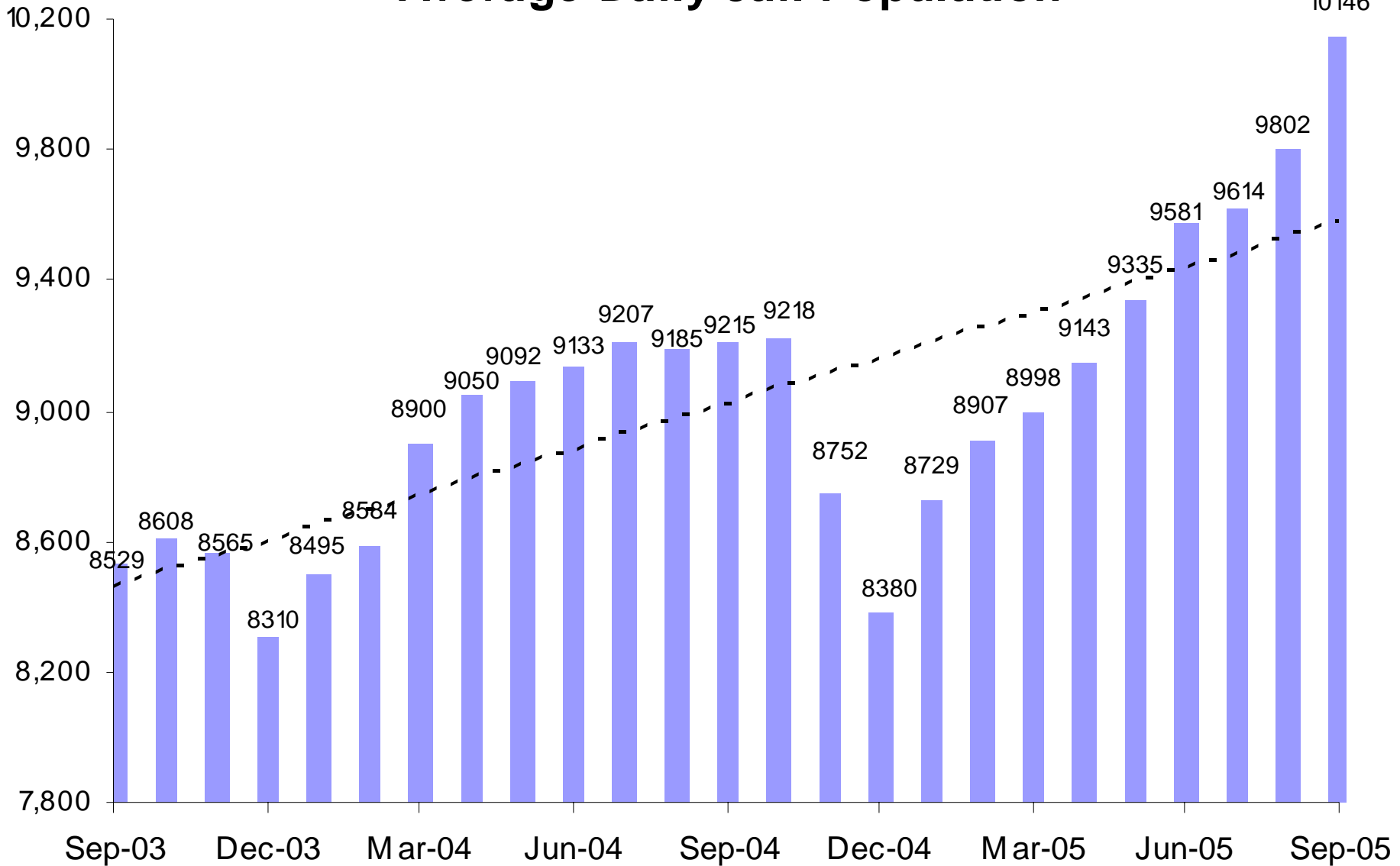
Juvenile Detention and Probation: The average daily population increased slightly, from 400 in August to 403 in September. Juvenile detention's capacity is 406. The length of stay decreased from 18.0 days to 17.7 days. Electronic monitoring increased from 60 to 63. Home detention fell from 230 in August to 223 in September. This is the lowest level since September 2004.

Levels of juvenile standard probation fell from August's 4,106 to September's 4,094. Levels of juvenile intensive probation rose from 551 to 566.

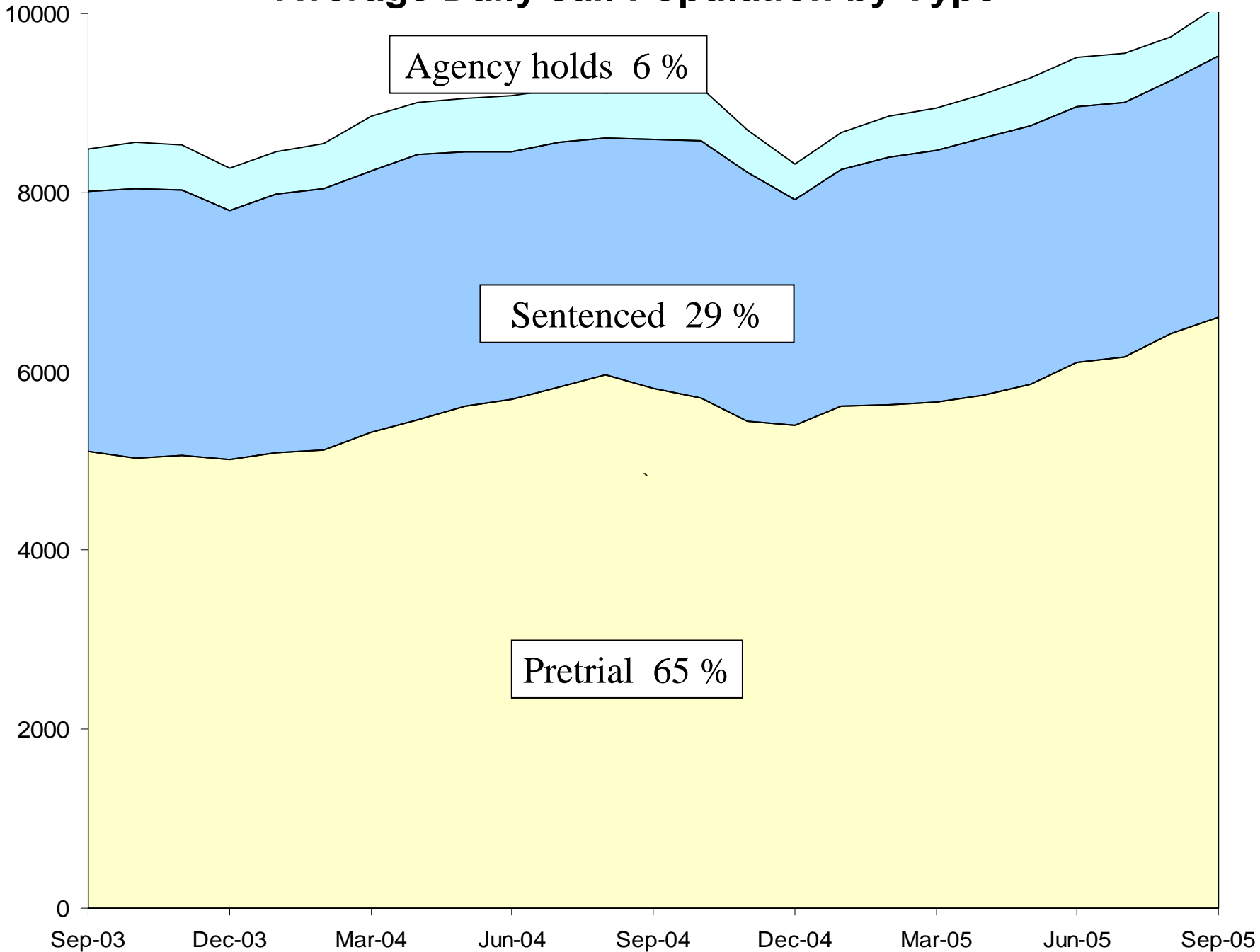

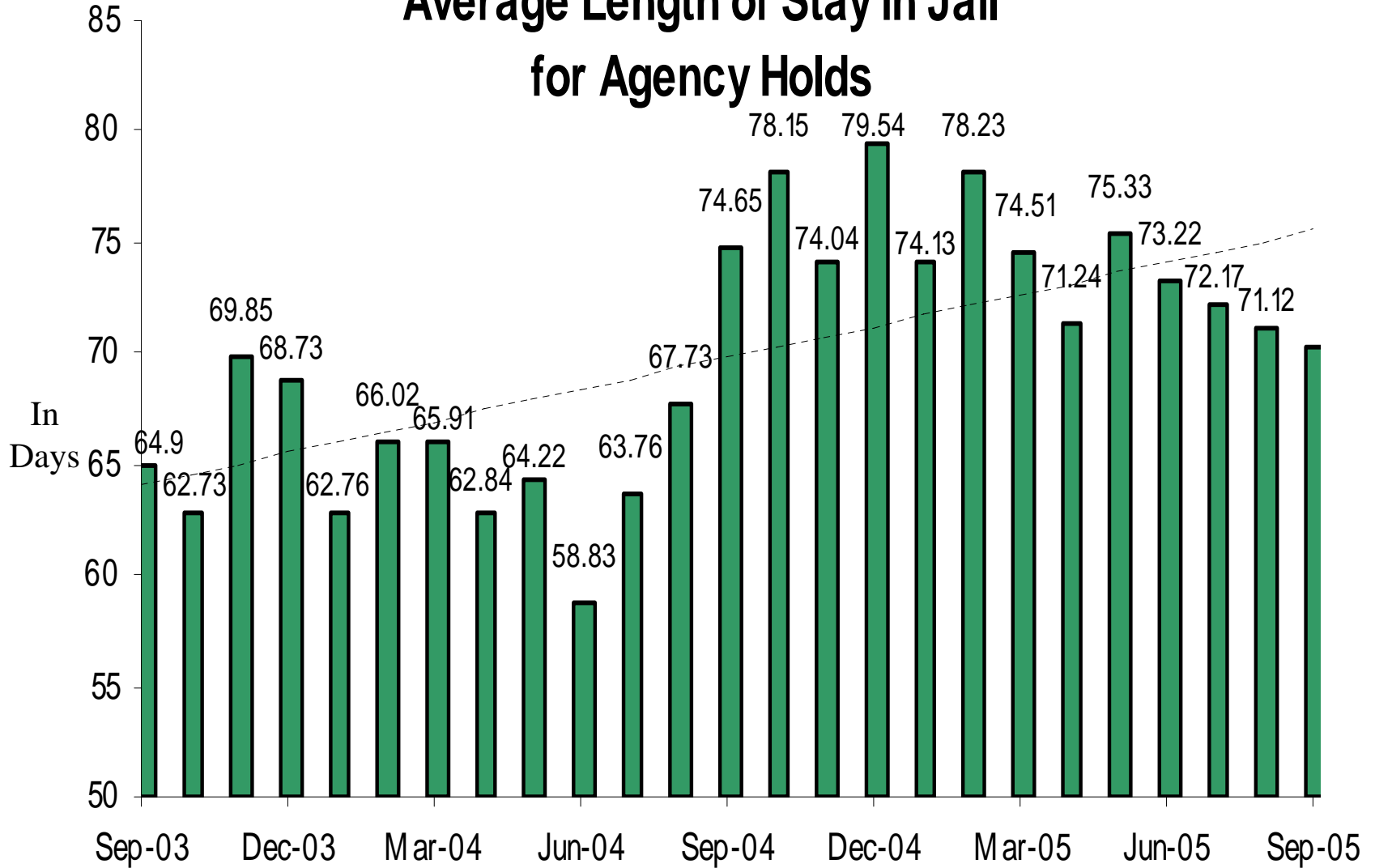
Average Daily Jail Population



Average Daily Jail Population by Type

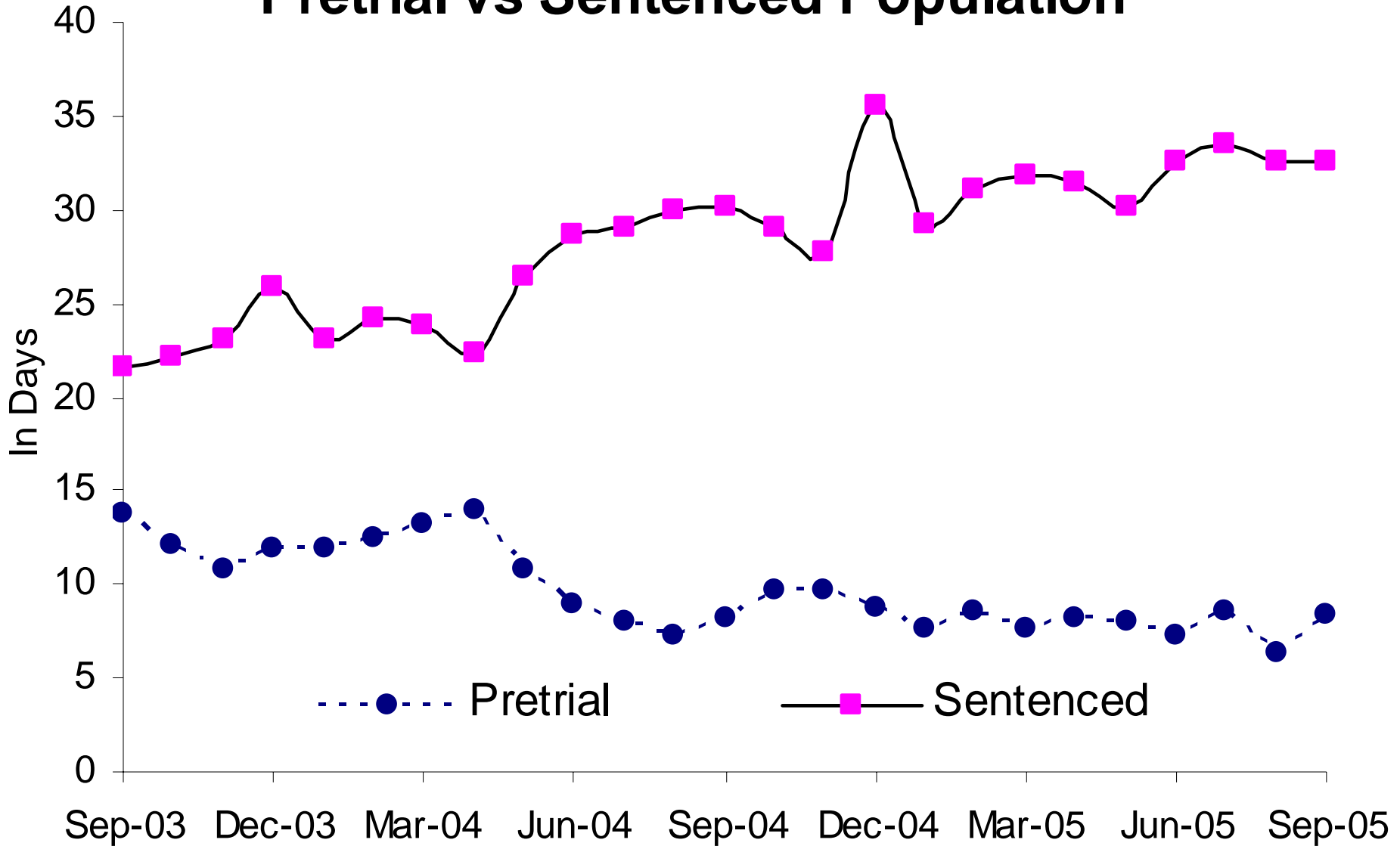


Average Length of Stay in Jail for Agency Holds

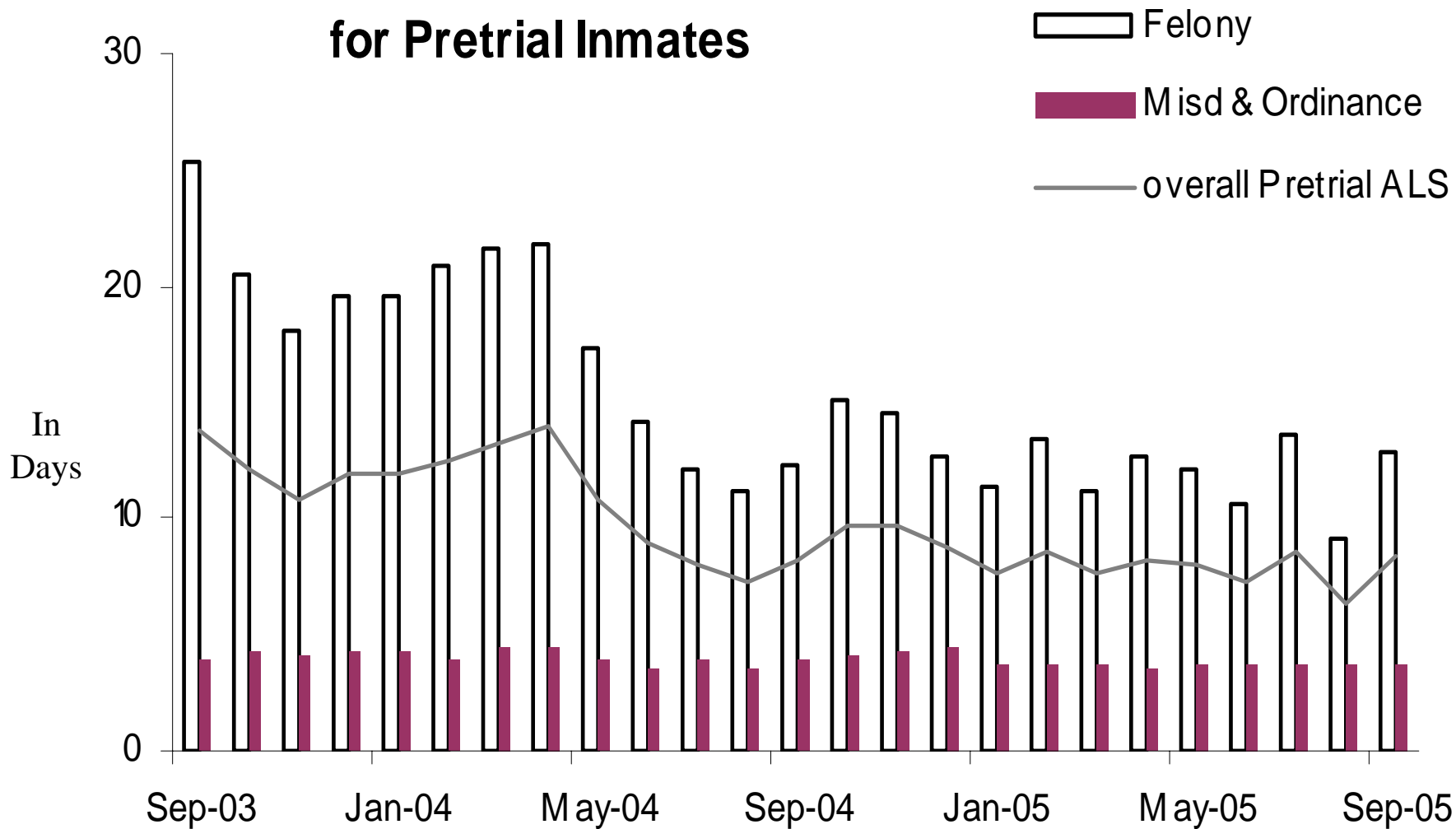

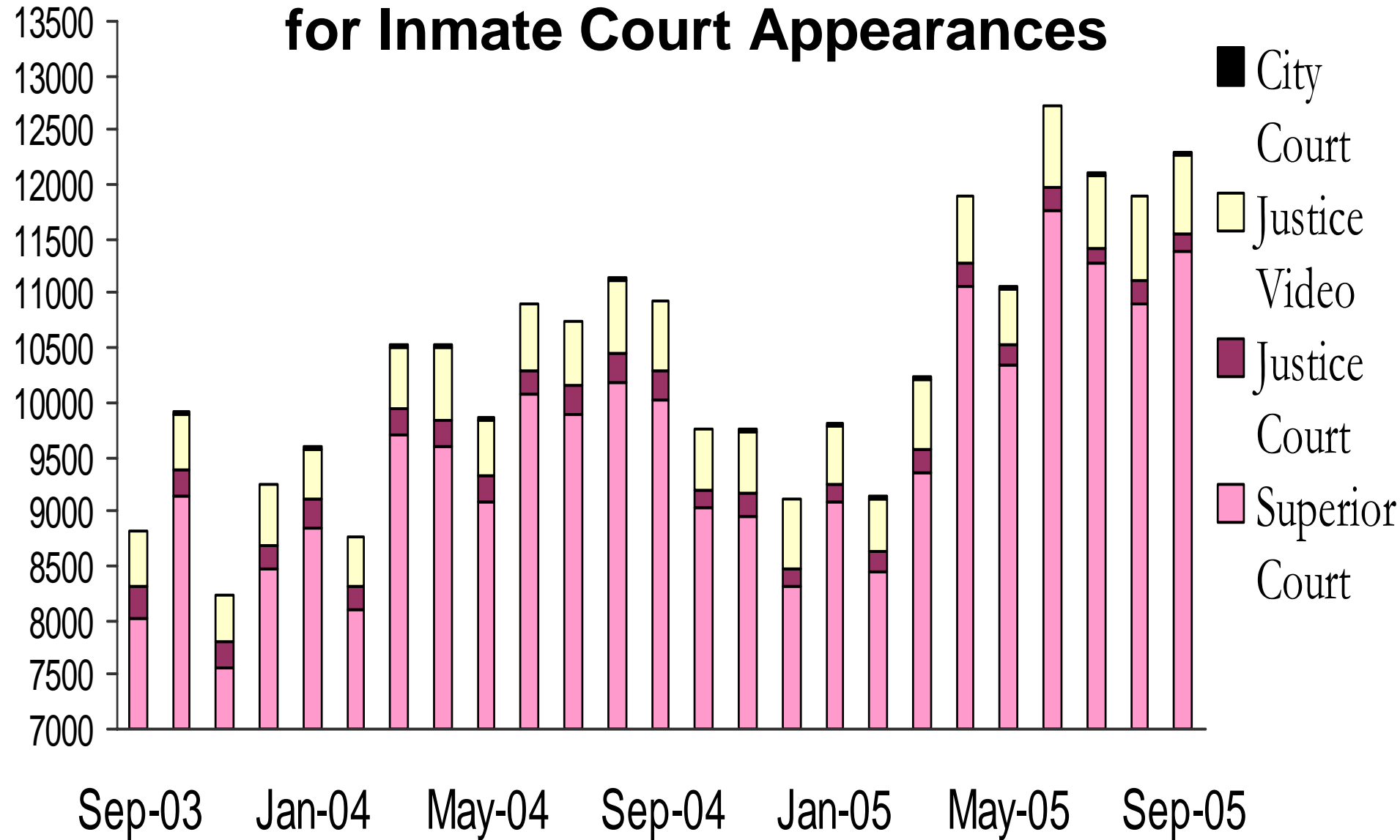
Average Length of Stay in Jail Pretrial vs Sentenced Population



Average Length of Stay in Jail for Pretrial Inmates



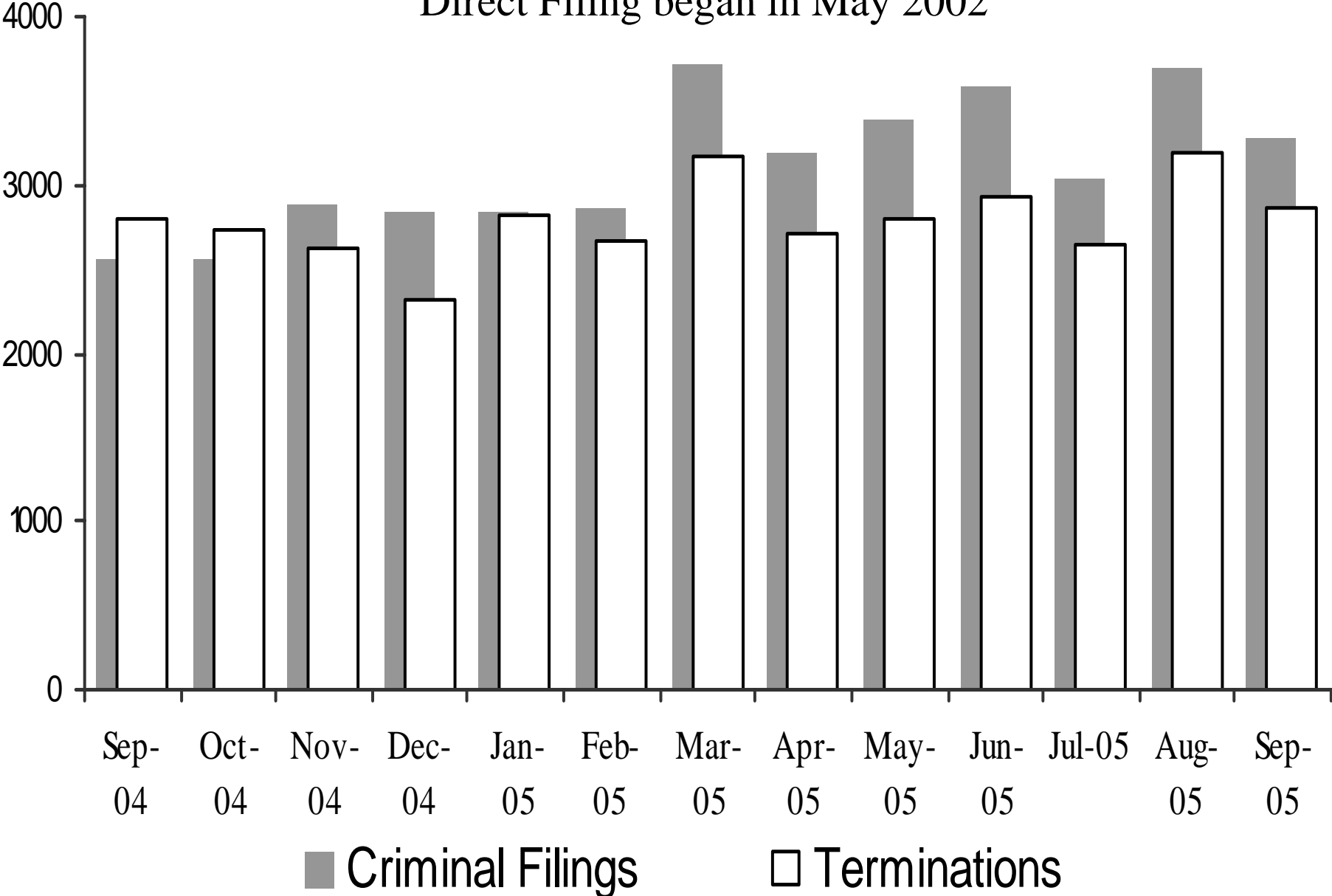
Sheriff's Office Transports for Inmate Court Appearances



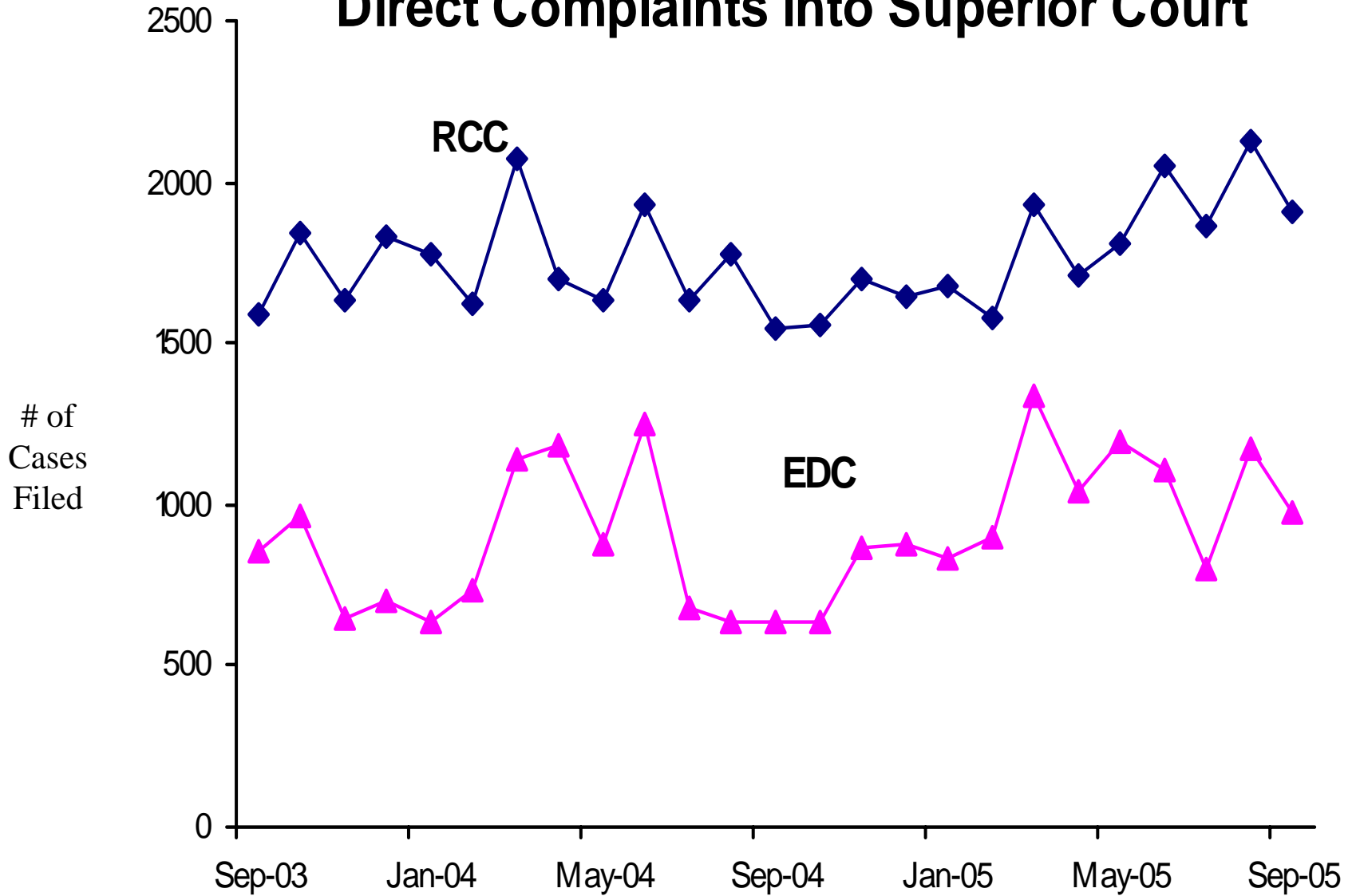
Since Direct Filing into Superior Court began May 2002, remaining transports to Justice Courts are for misdemeanor cases.

Superior Court Filings and Terminations

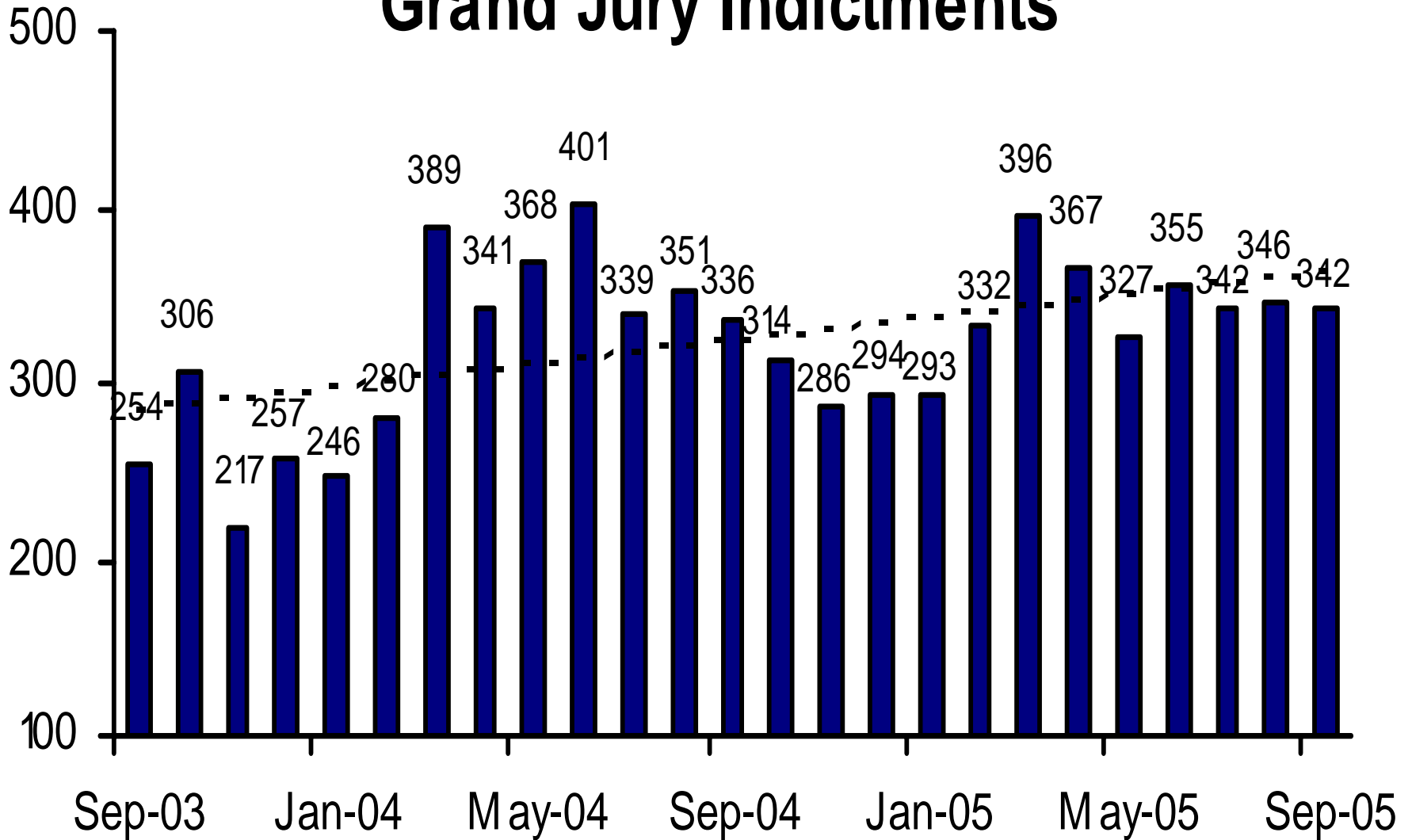
Direct Filing began in May 2002



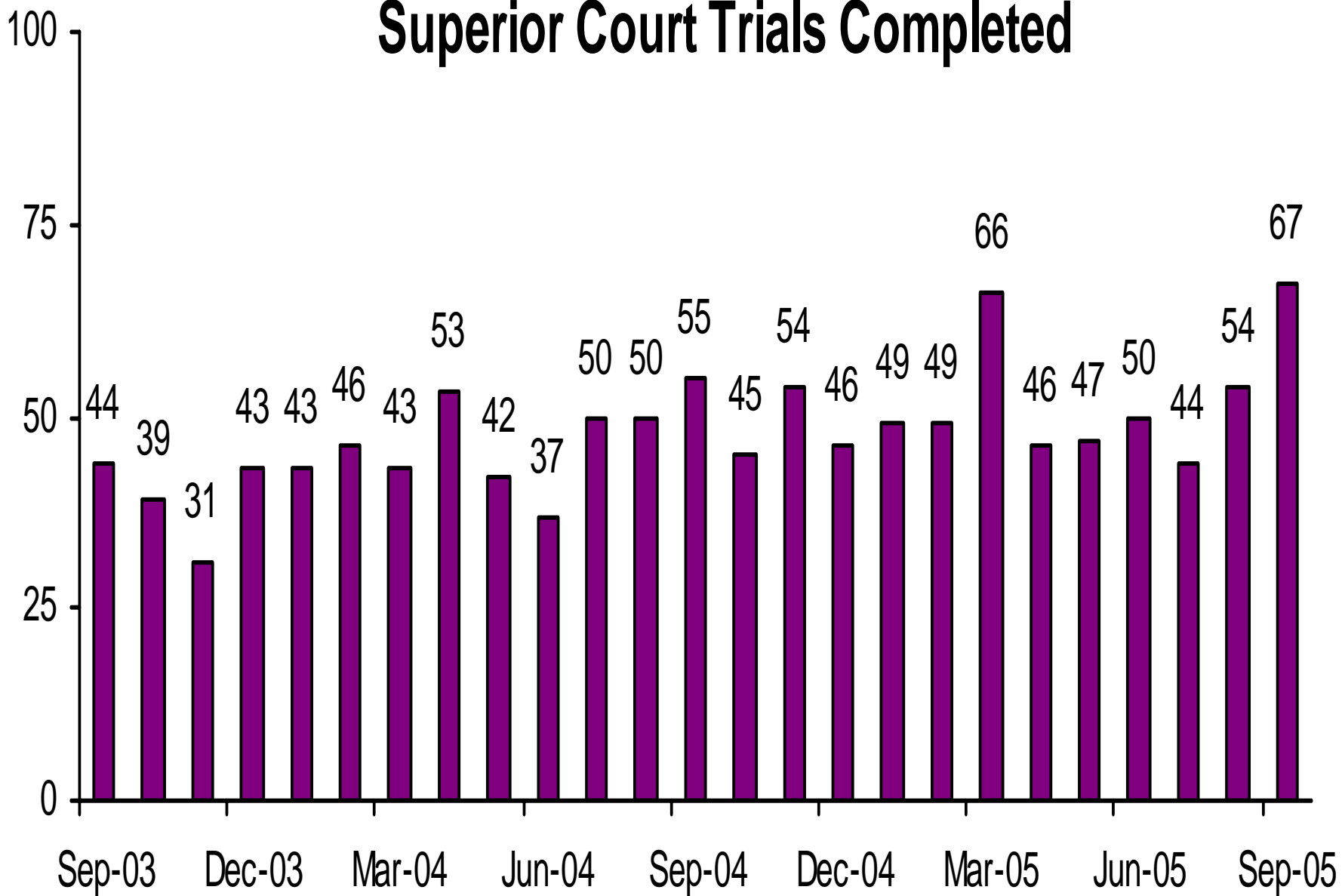
Direct Complaints into Superior Court



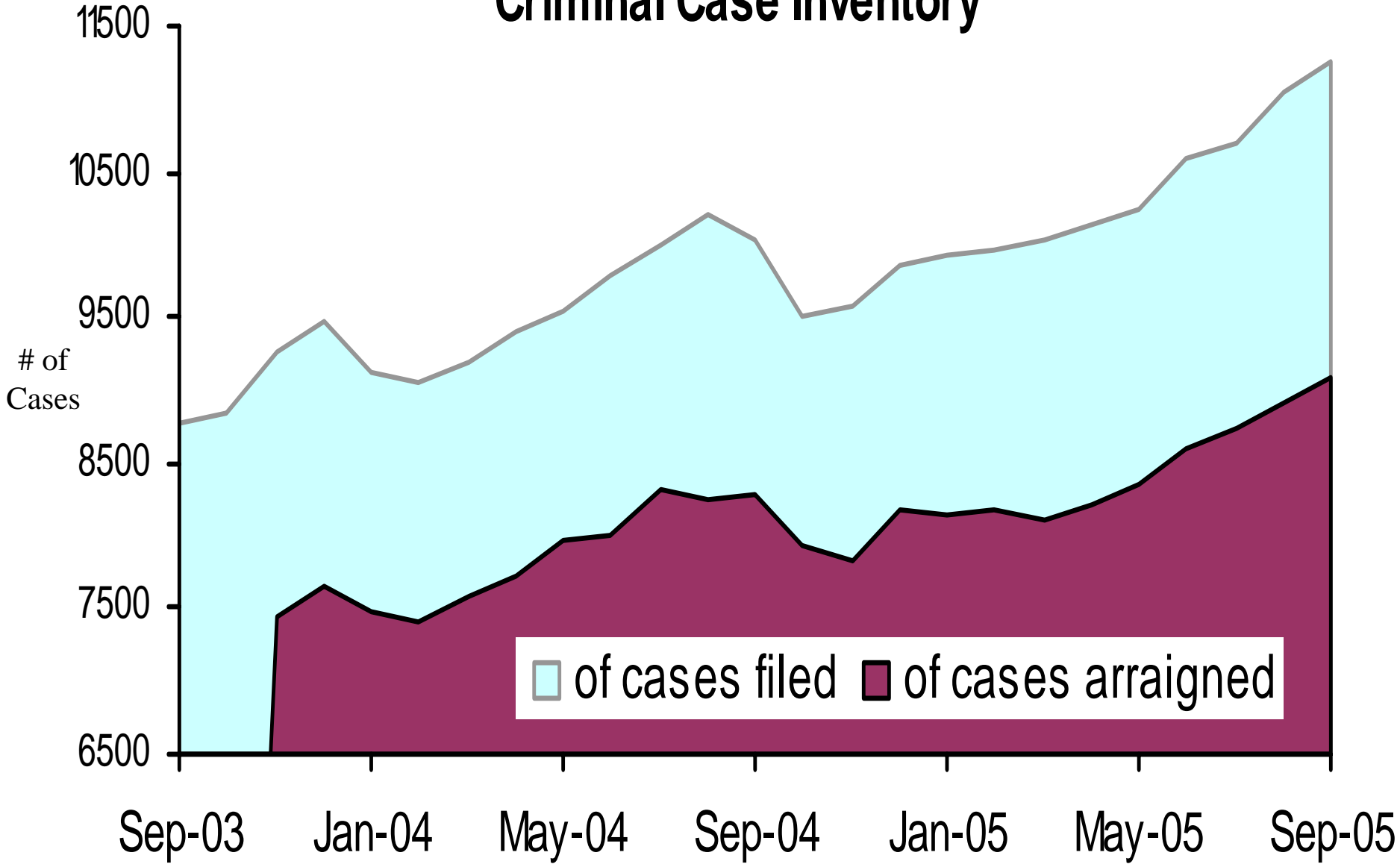
Grand Jury Indictments



Superior Court Trials Completed

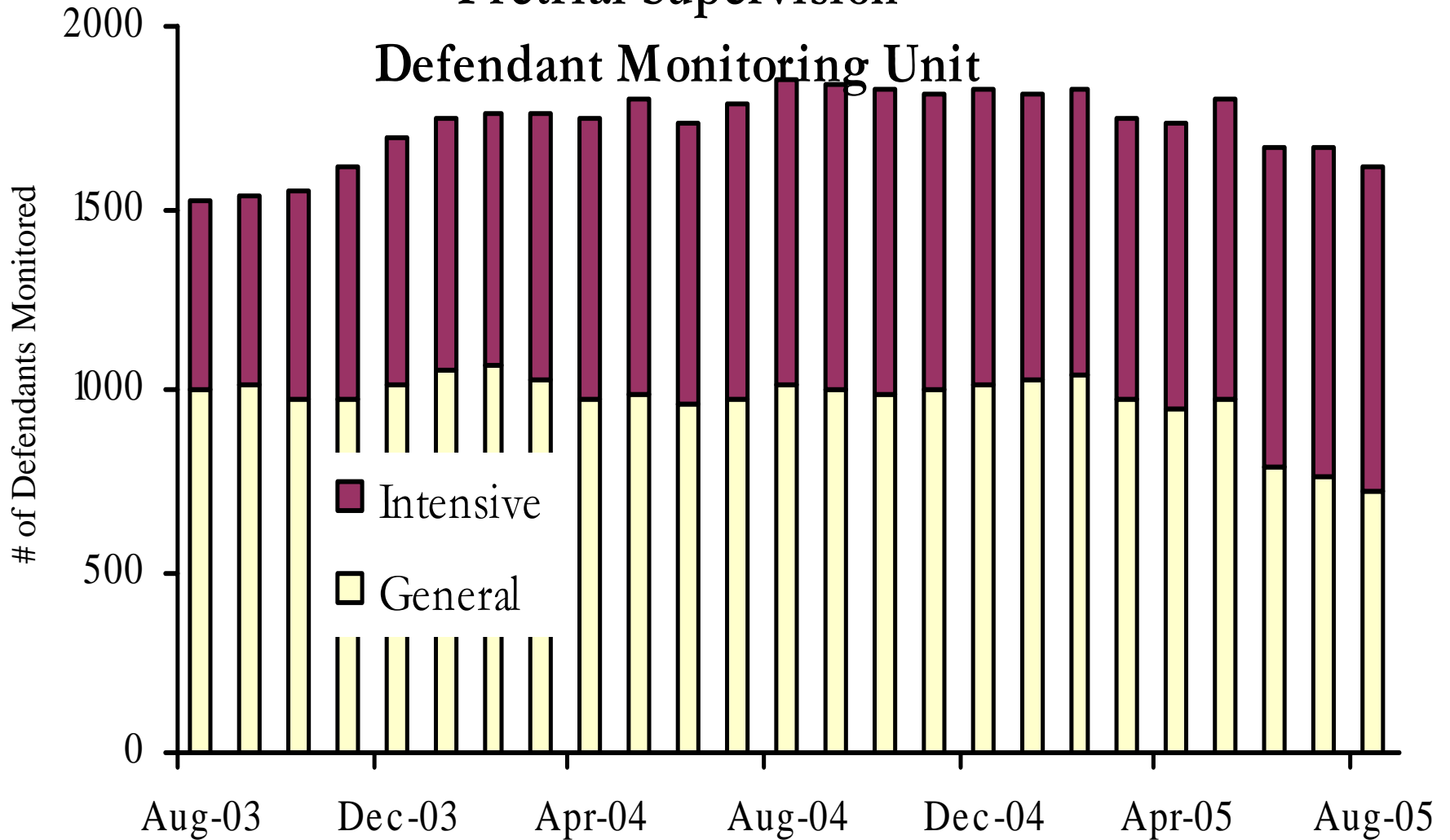


Active Pending Criminal Case Inventory



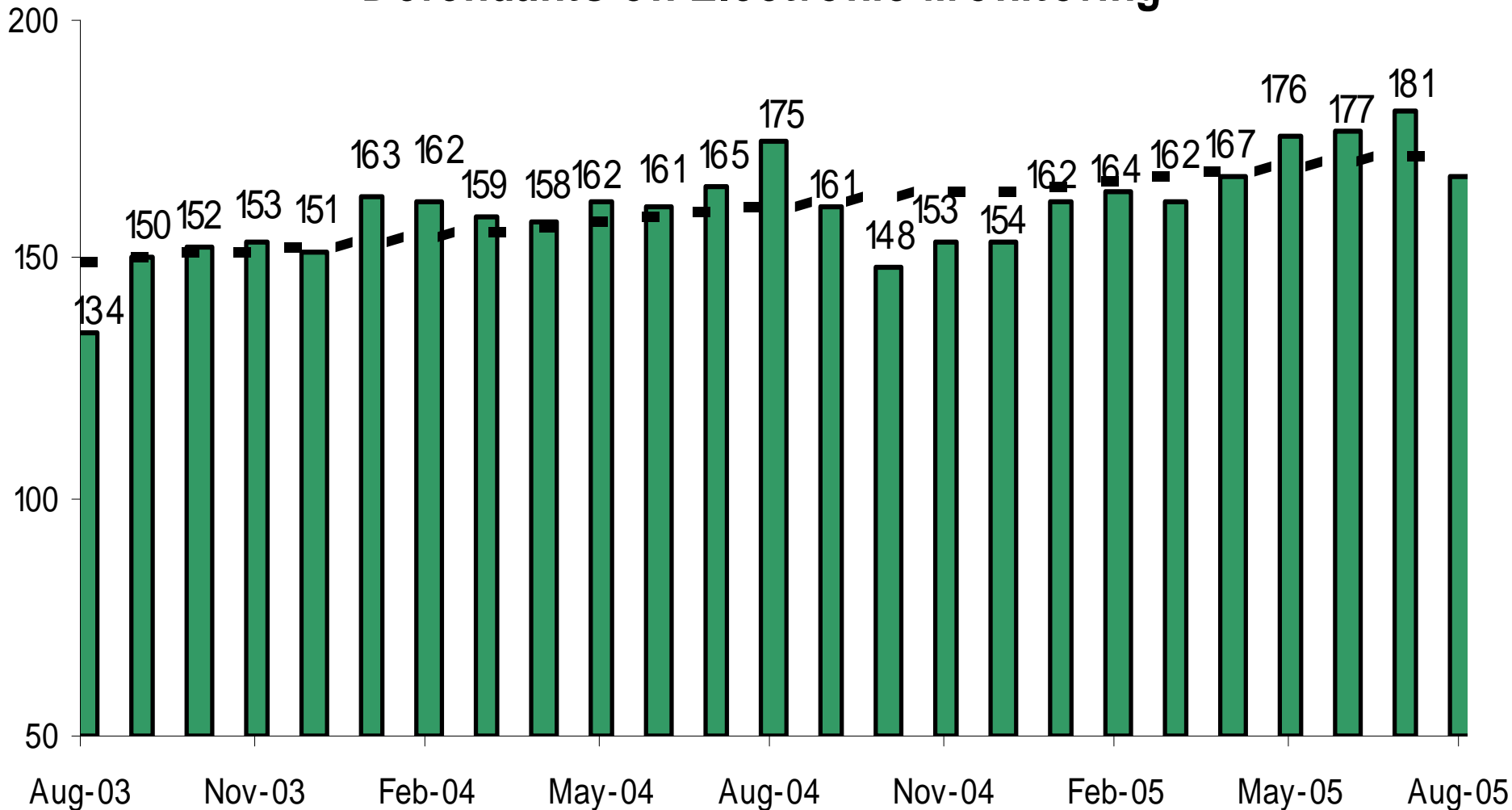

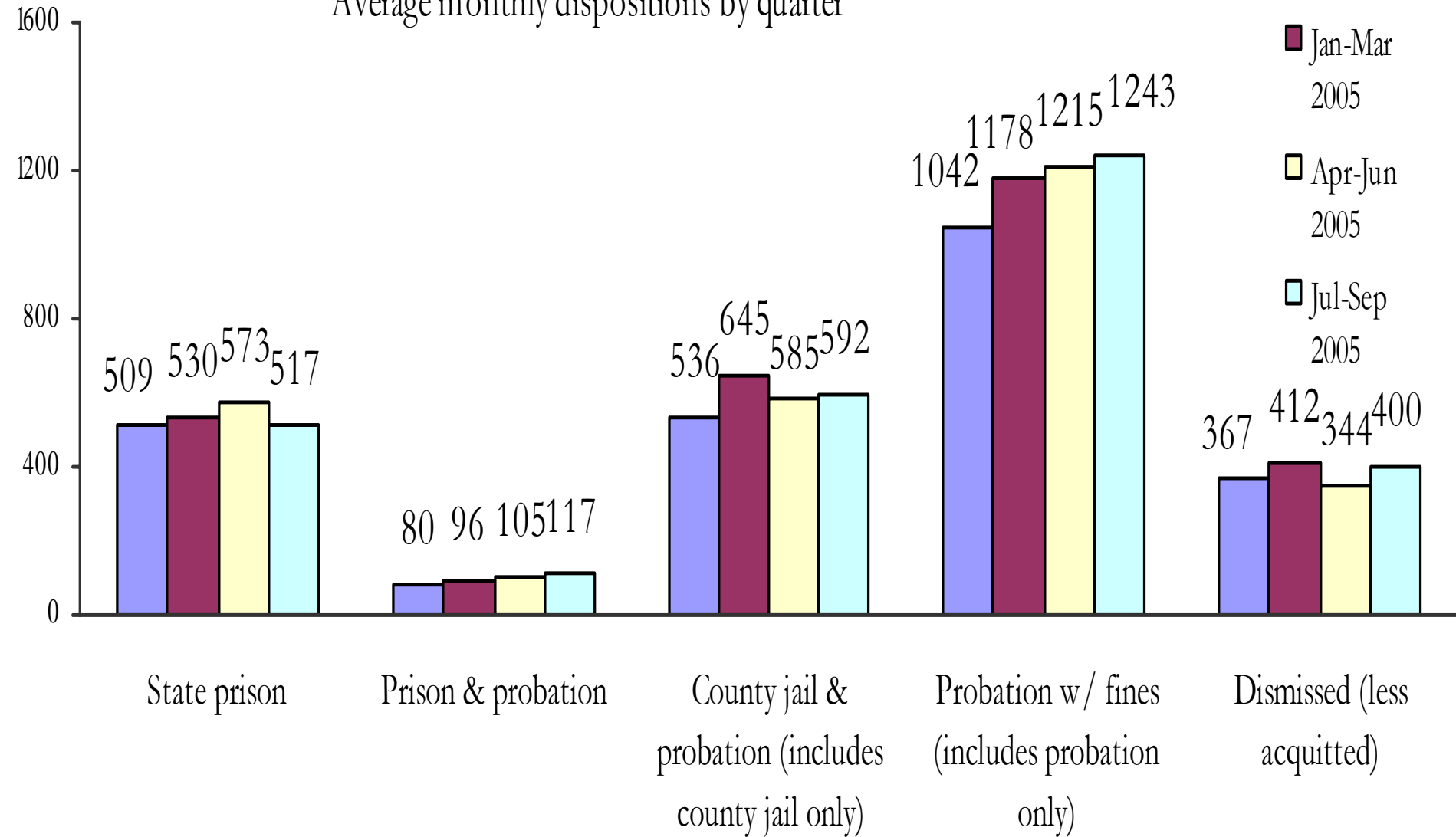

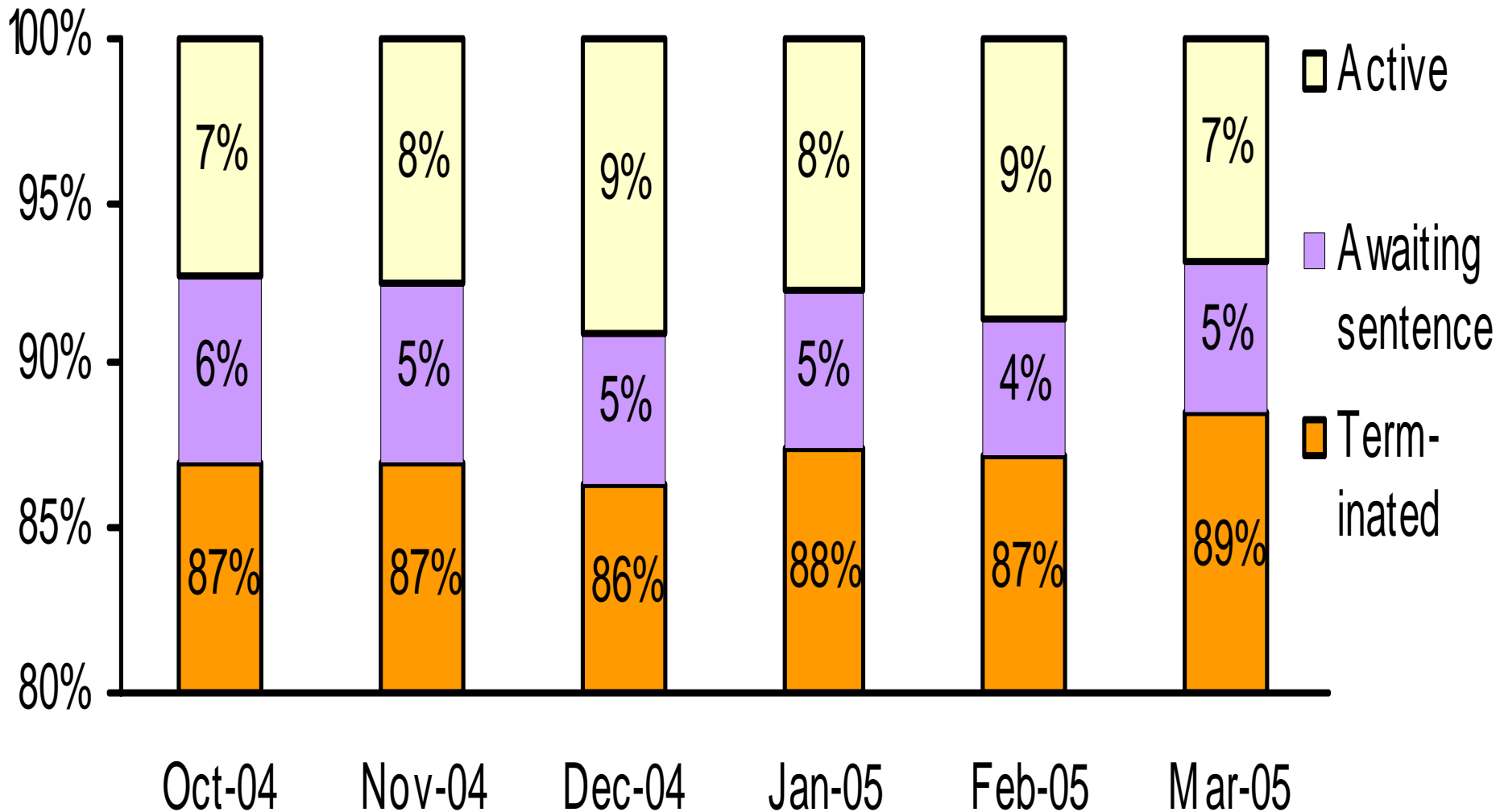

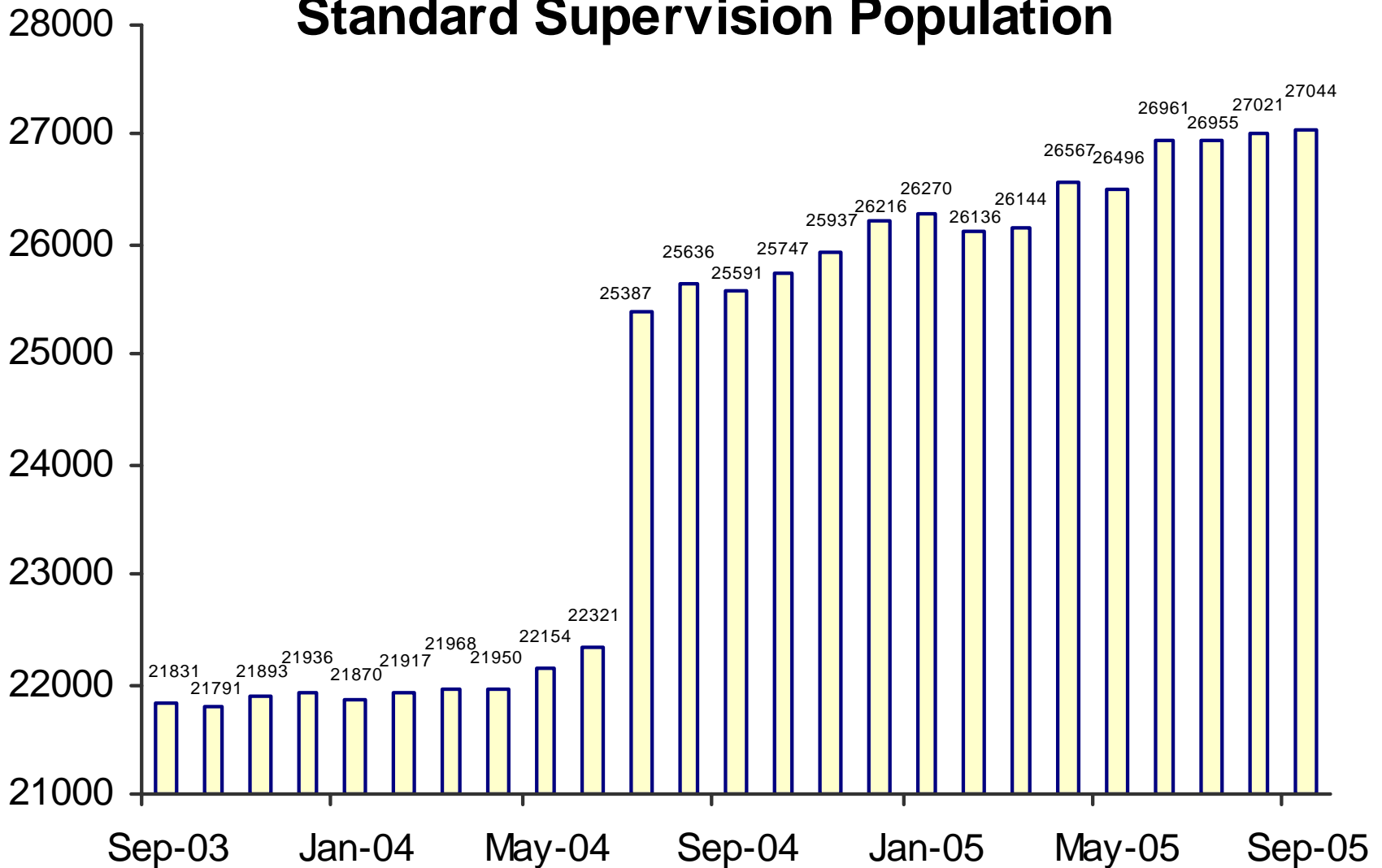

Status of Cases After 180 Days

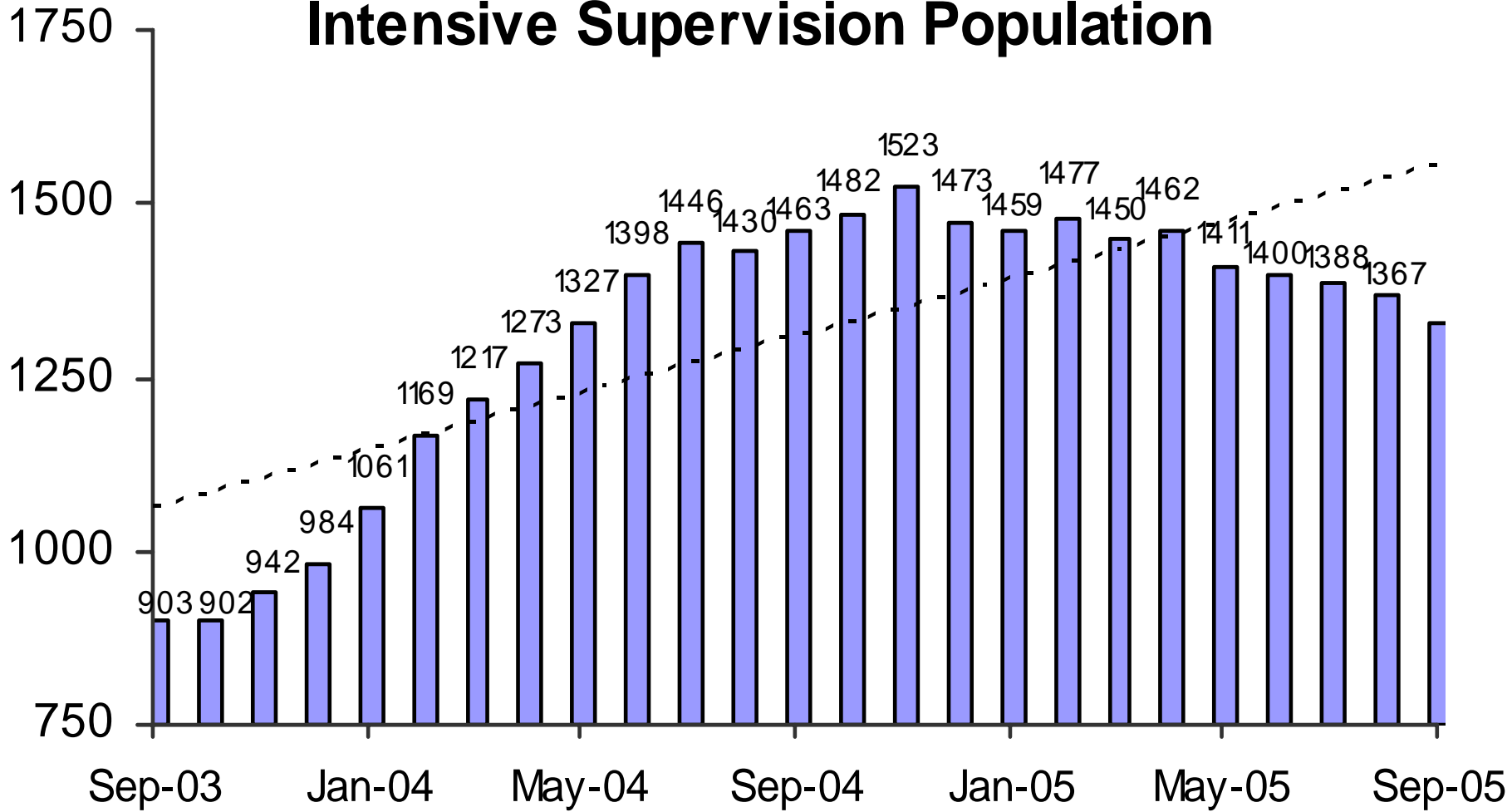


Adult Probation Standard Supervision Population

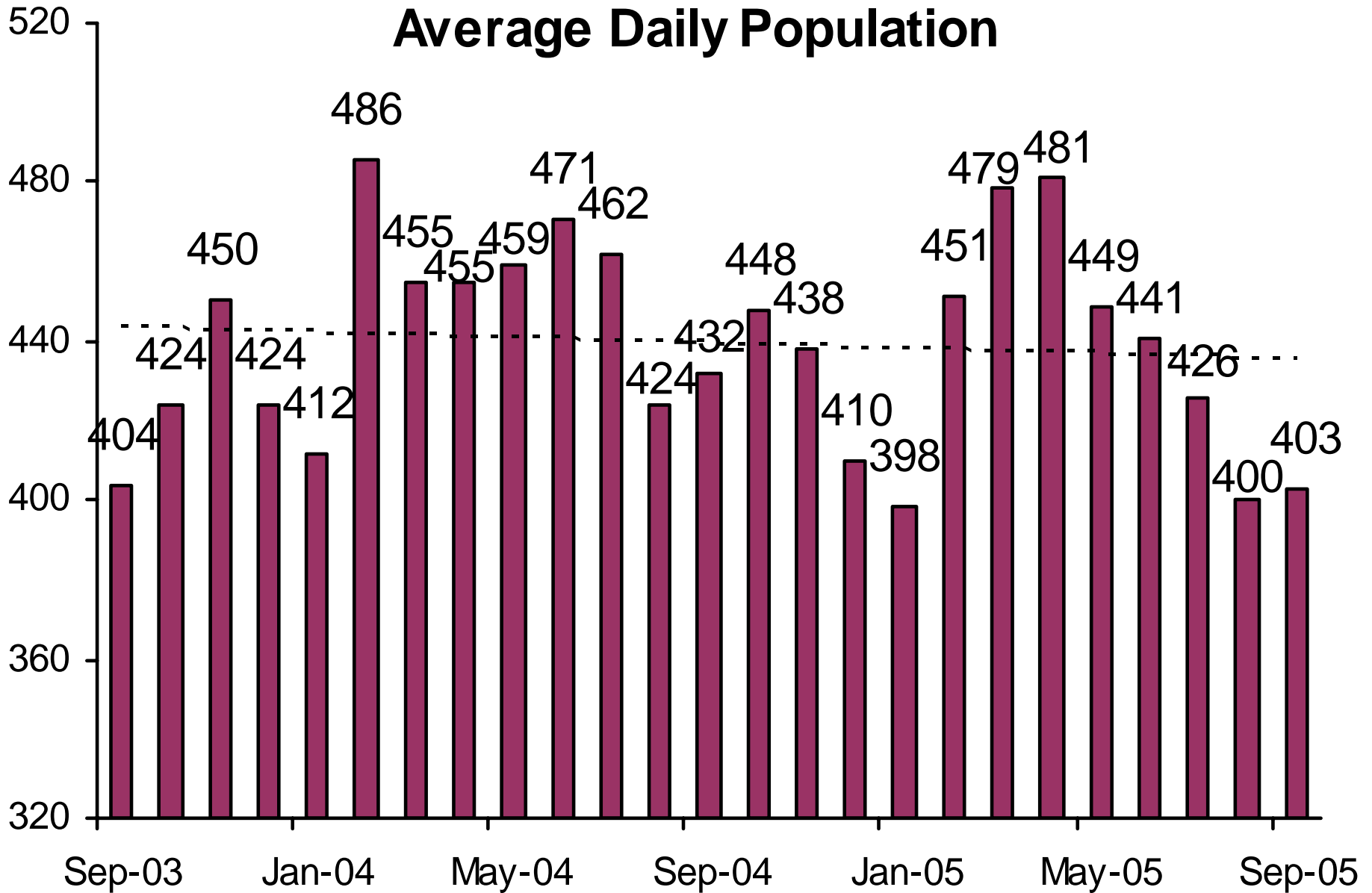

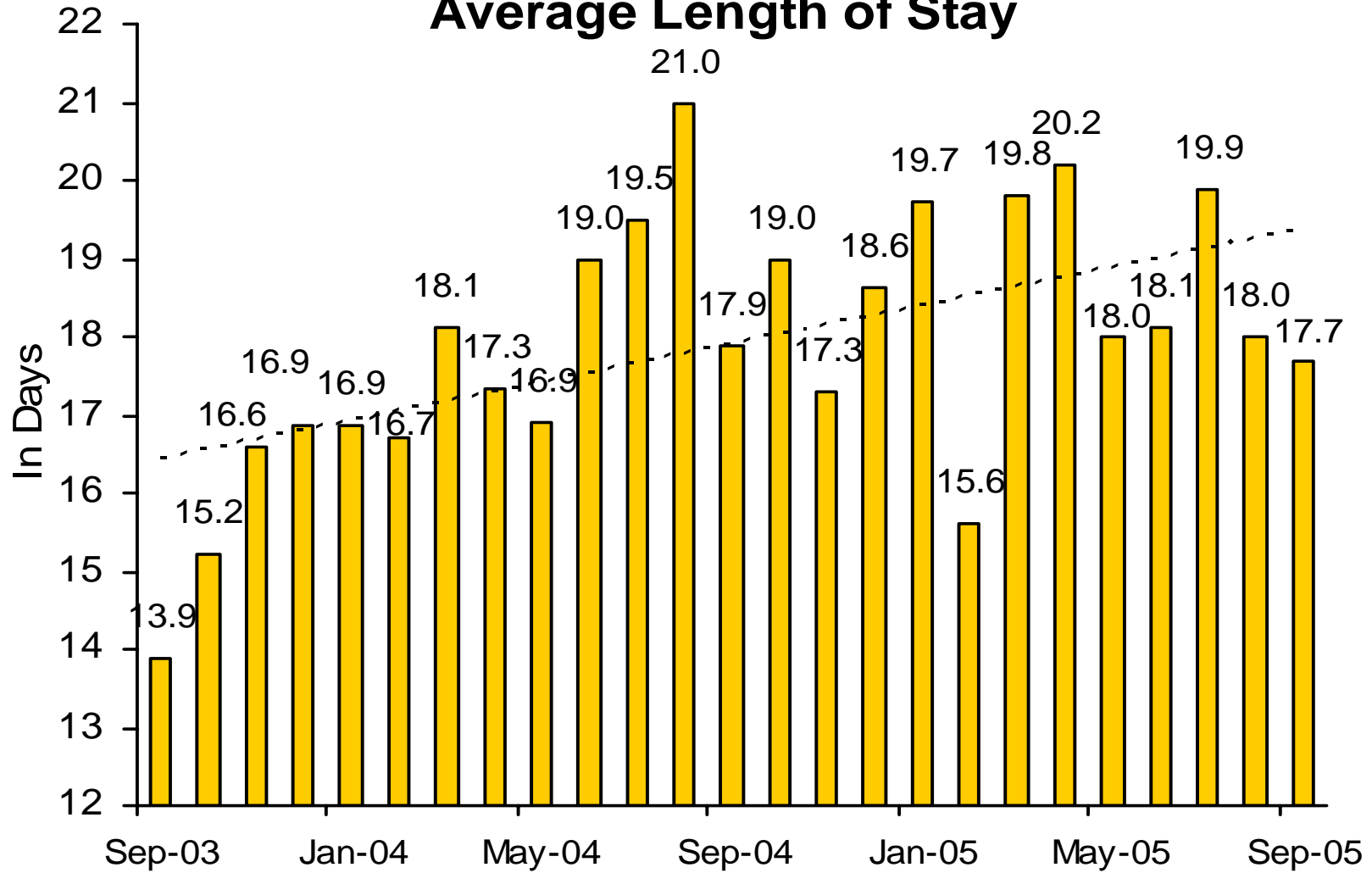
Adult Probation Intensive Supervision Population



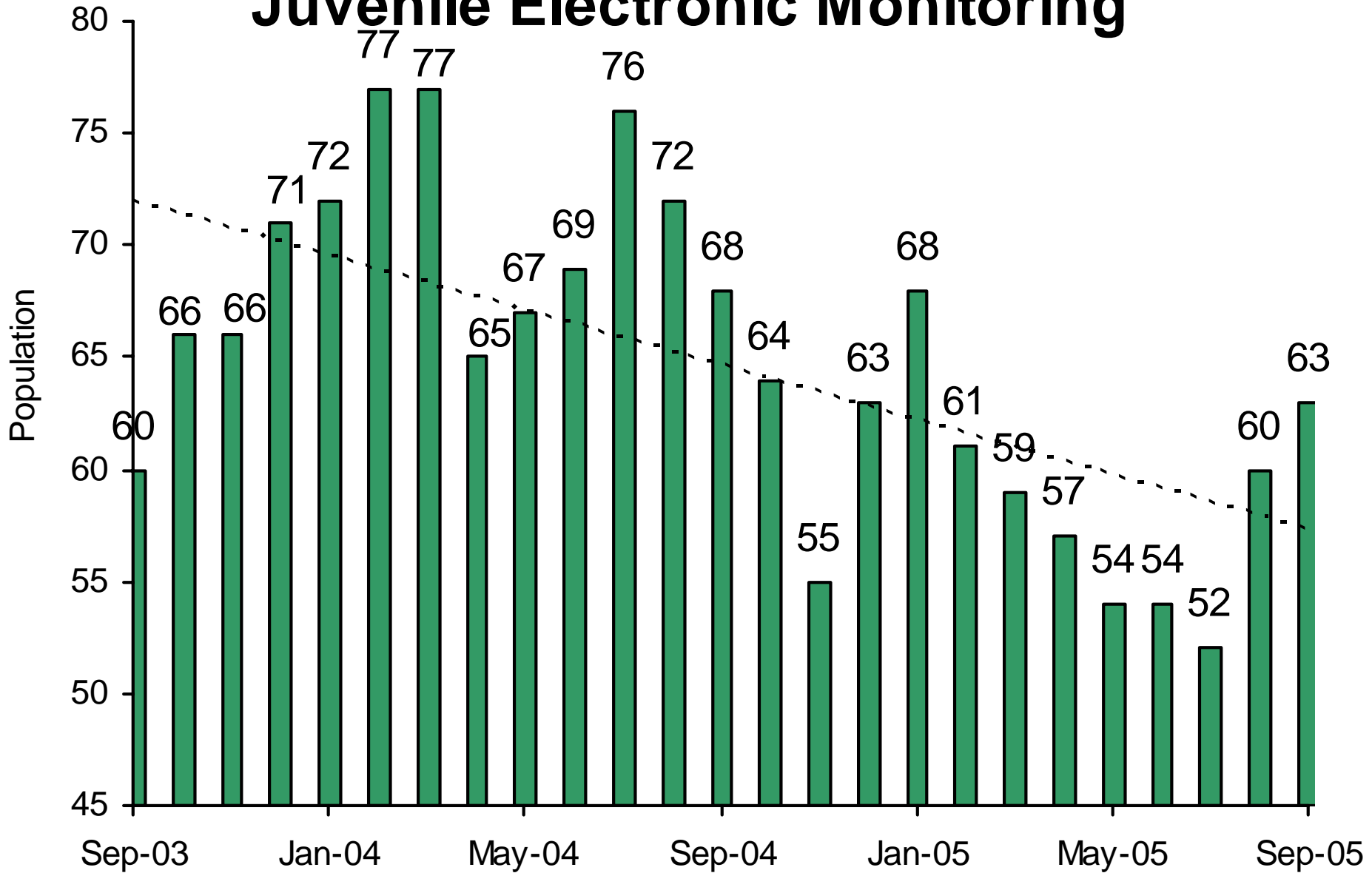
Juvenile Detention Average Daily Population



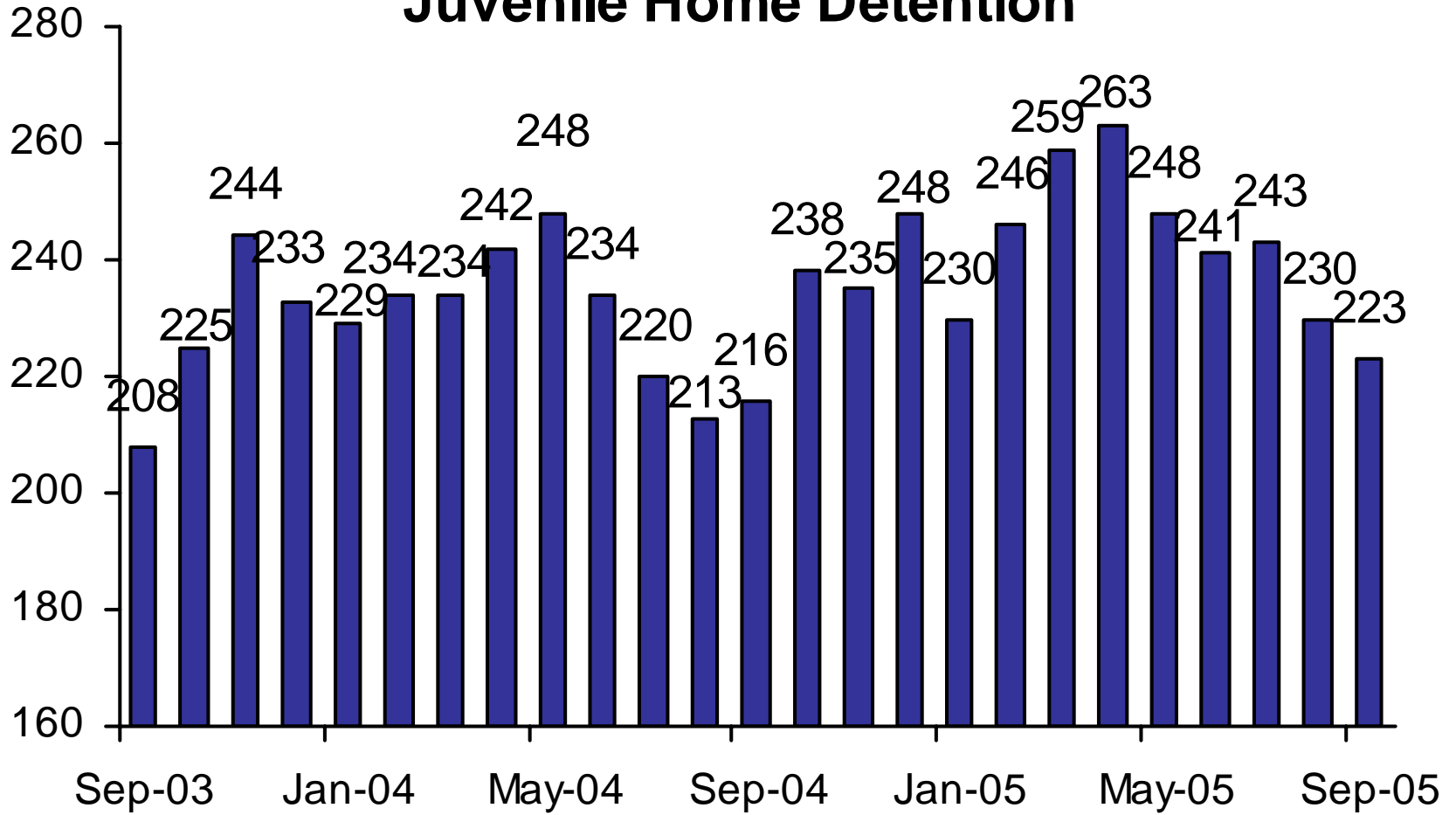
Juvenile Detention Average Length of Stay
