**Criminal Justice System News**

**Adult Incarceration:** Bookings decreased from 10,908 in January to 9,755 in February. The Average Daily Population increased from 9,665 to 9,692. The pretrial population decreased slightly from January (6,304) to February (6,196) while the sentenced and agency holds increased. Sentenced went from 2,788 to 2,902 and agency holds from 517 to 531. The overall average length of stay increased slightly, from 27.5 days to 27.8 days.

The Average Length of Stay increased for all populations. ALOS for agency holds went from 72.7 days to 78.6 days; sentenced went from 31.6 to 33.7 days; overall pretrial went from 7.0 to 9.3 days. Breaking down the pretrial population, felony holds increased from 11.0 days to 15.2 days, while misdemeanor holds increased from 2.9 days to 3.2 days.

**Filings & Case Processing:** Criminal filings increased slightly from 3,040 in January to 3,087 in February. Terminations decreased from 3,065 to 2,840, resulting in a termination rate of 92%. The active pending case inventory decreased from 11,029 to 10,732. This is the lowest rate since July 2005 (10,697). Filings into the RCC decreased from January's 1,871 to February's 1,724. Filings into the EDC increased from 812 to 955. Grand Jury indictments increased from 306 in January to 372 in February.

**Adult Probation:** Levels of pretrial general supervision decreased slightly from 781 to 747. Levels of pretrial intensive and electronic monitoring increased slightly: intensive from 1,208 to 1,211 and electronic from 185 to 197. Both pretrial intensive and electronic monitoring levels are the highest ever.

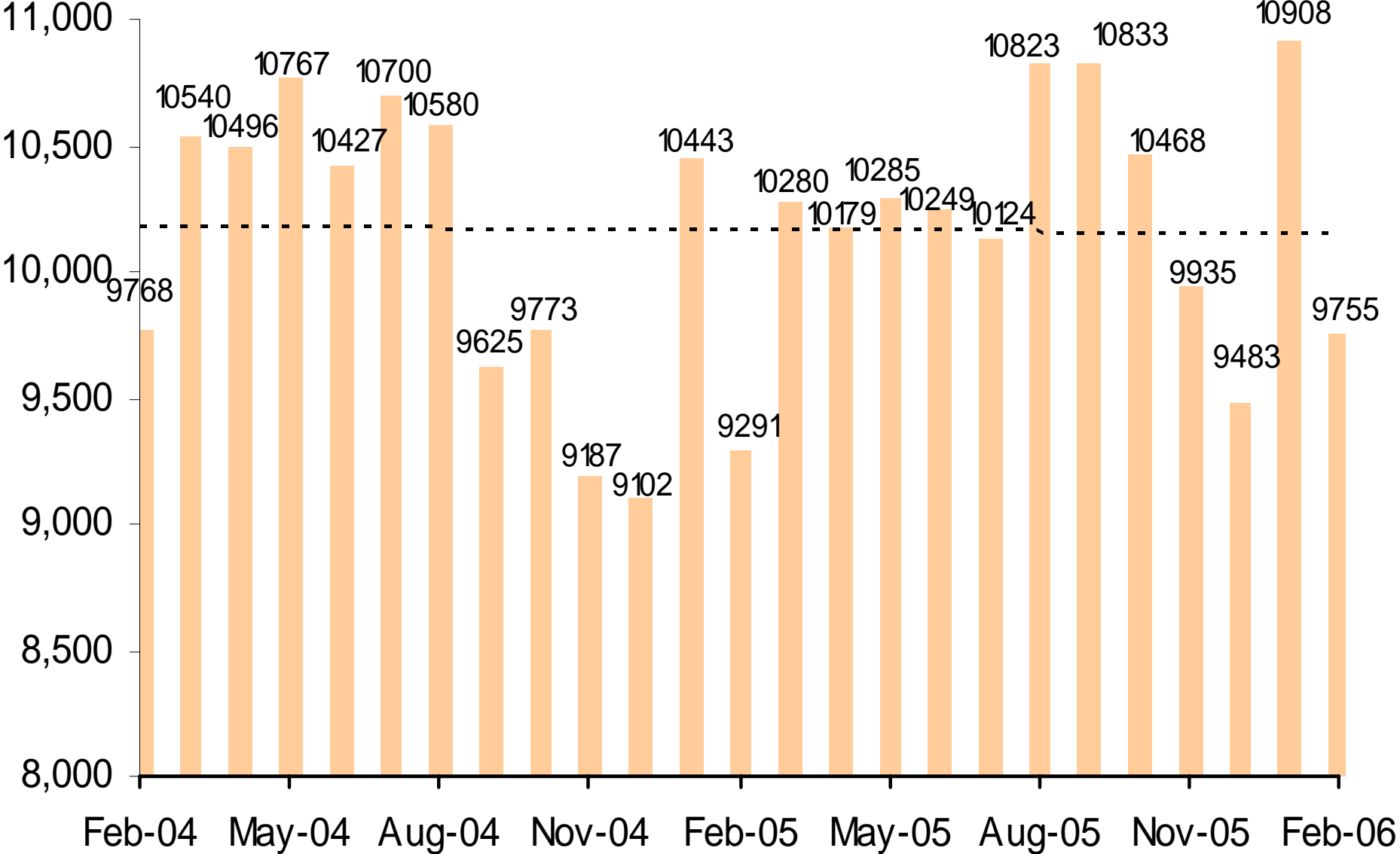
Levels of standard probation supervision increased from January (27,846) to February (28,230); this is the highest number ever seen. Levels of intensive probation supervision decreased from 1,302 to 1,286. This is the lowest since April 2004 (1,273).

**Juvenile Detention and Probation:** The Average Daily Population increased from 406 in January to 423 in February. ALOS decreased from 19.5 days to 17.0 days. Electronic monitoring decreased from 97 to 90. Home detention increased from 261 to 252.

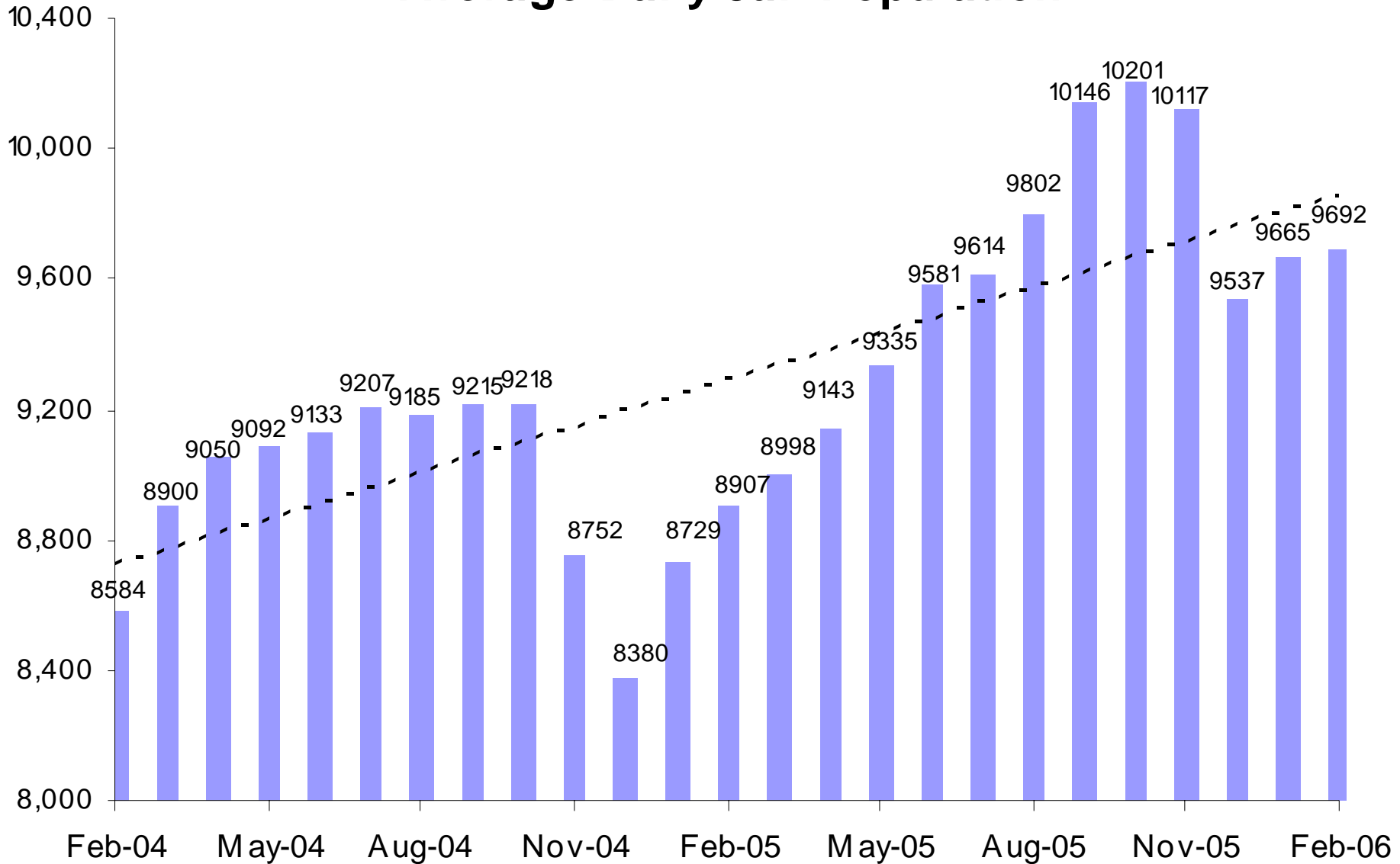
Levels of juvenile standard and intensive probation decreased. Standard went from 4,003 to 3,937, while intensive went from 524 to 498.

A criminal justice system-wide goal is to enhance the utility and timeliness of management information on case processing, in an effort to help agencies effectively address current events. 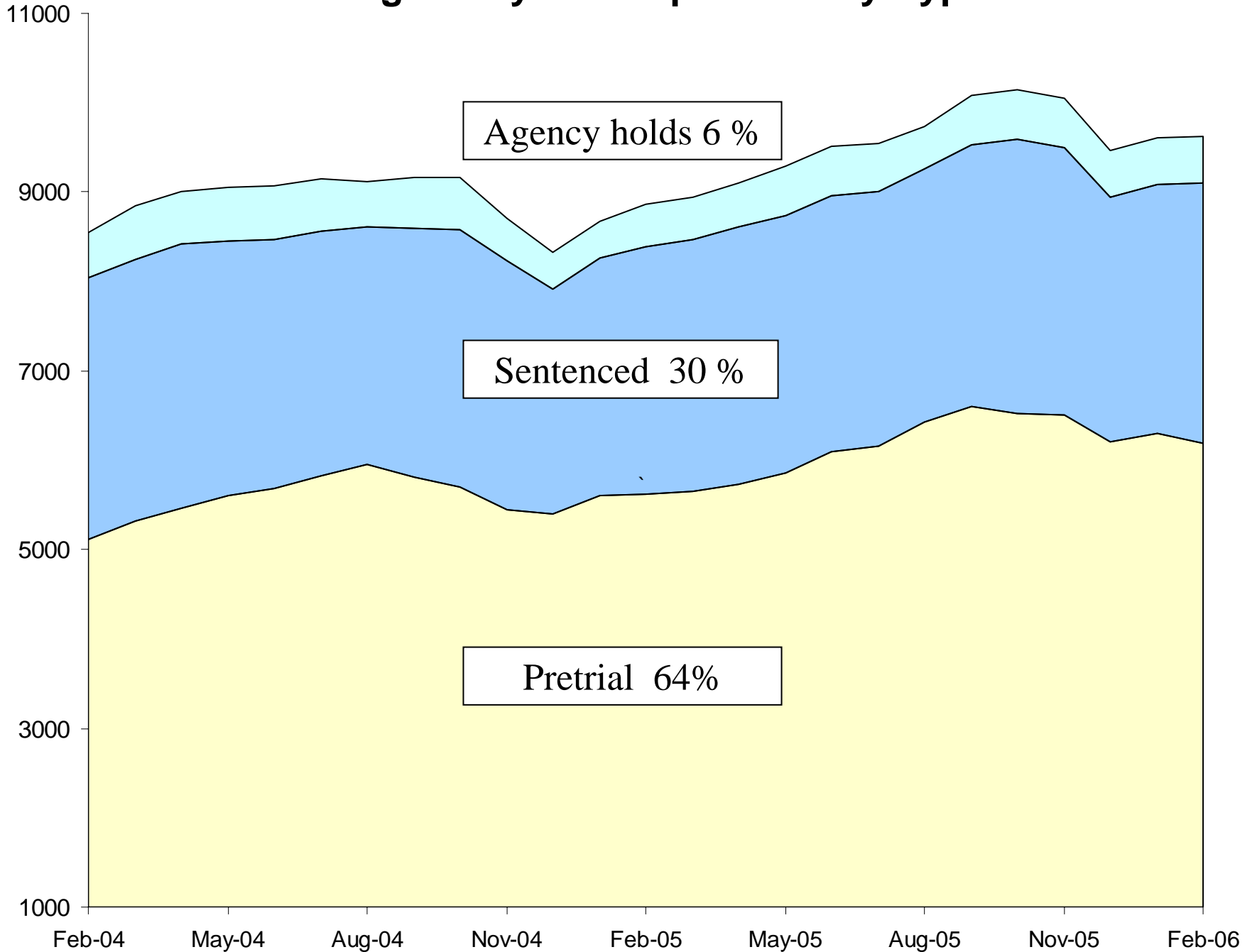

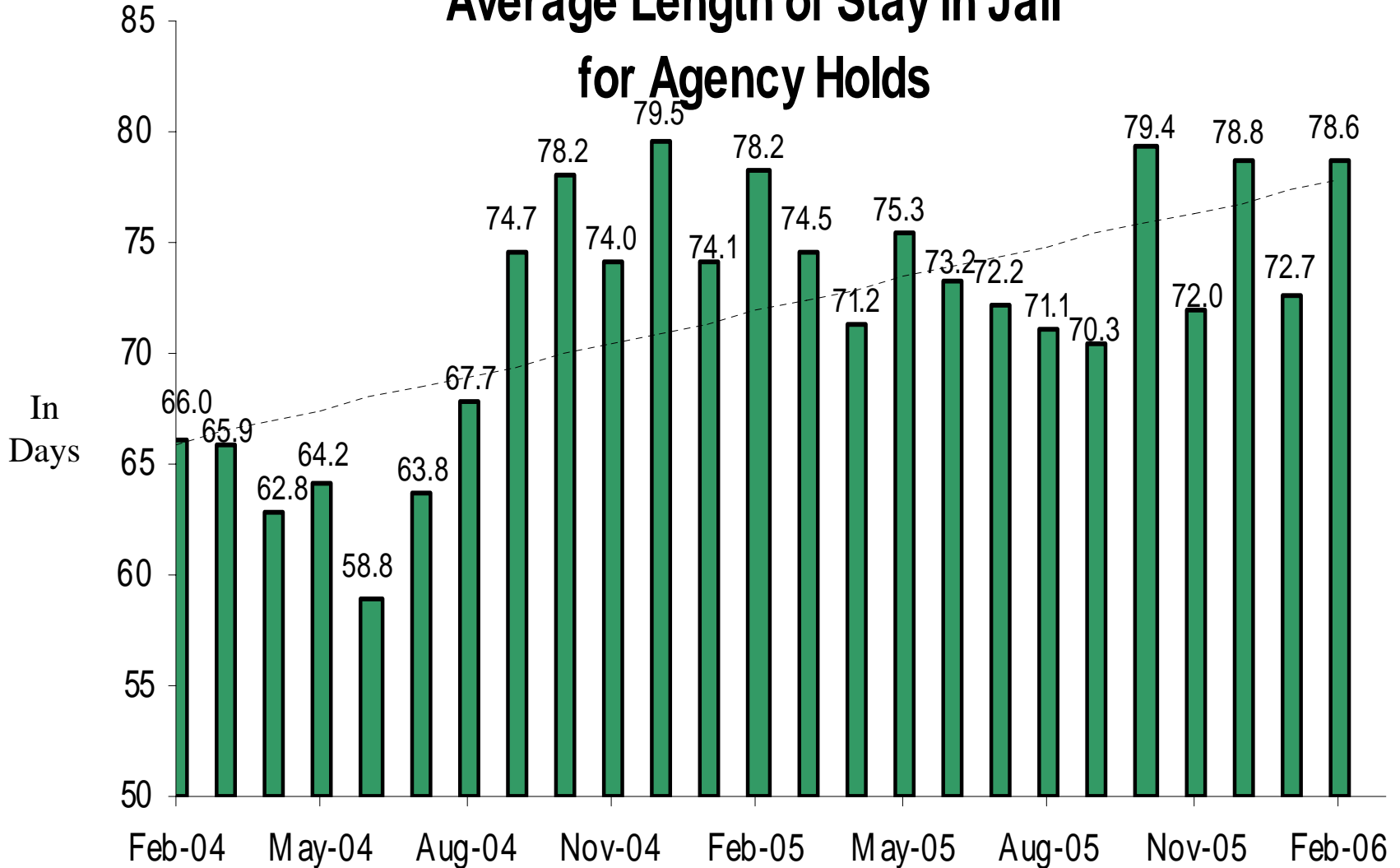
# Average Daily Jail Population



# Average Daily Jail Population by Type

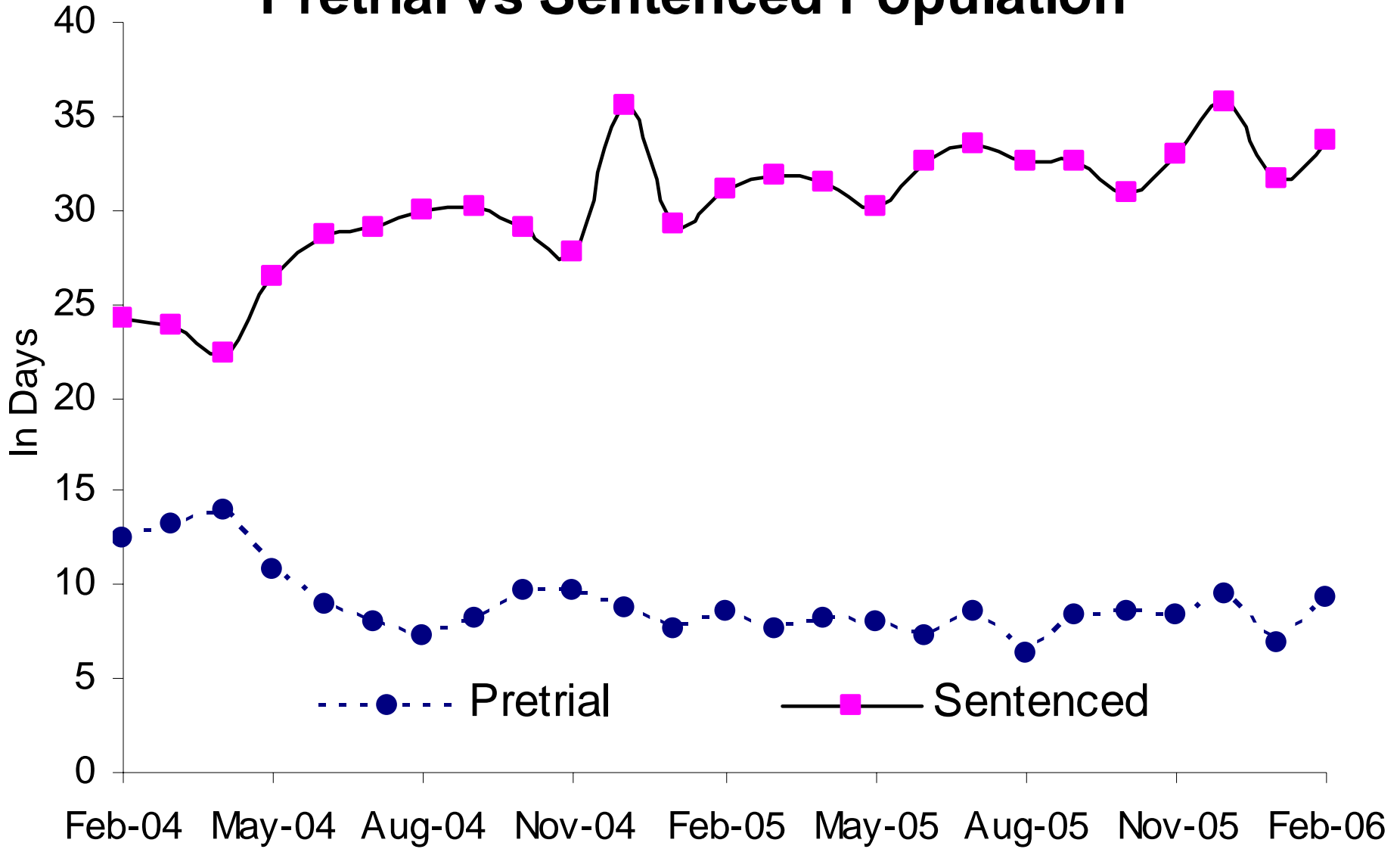


# Average Length of Stay in Jail for Agency Holds

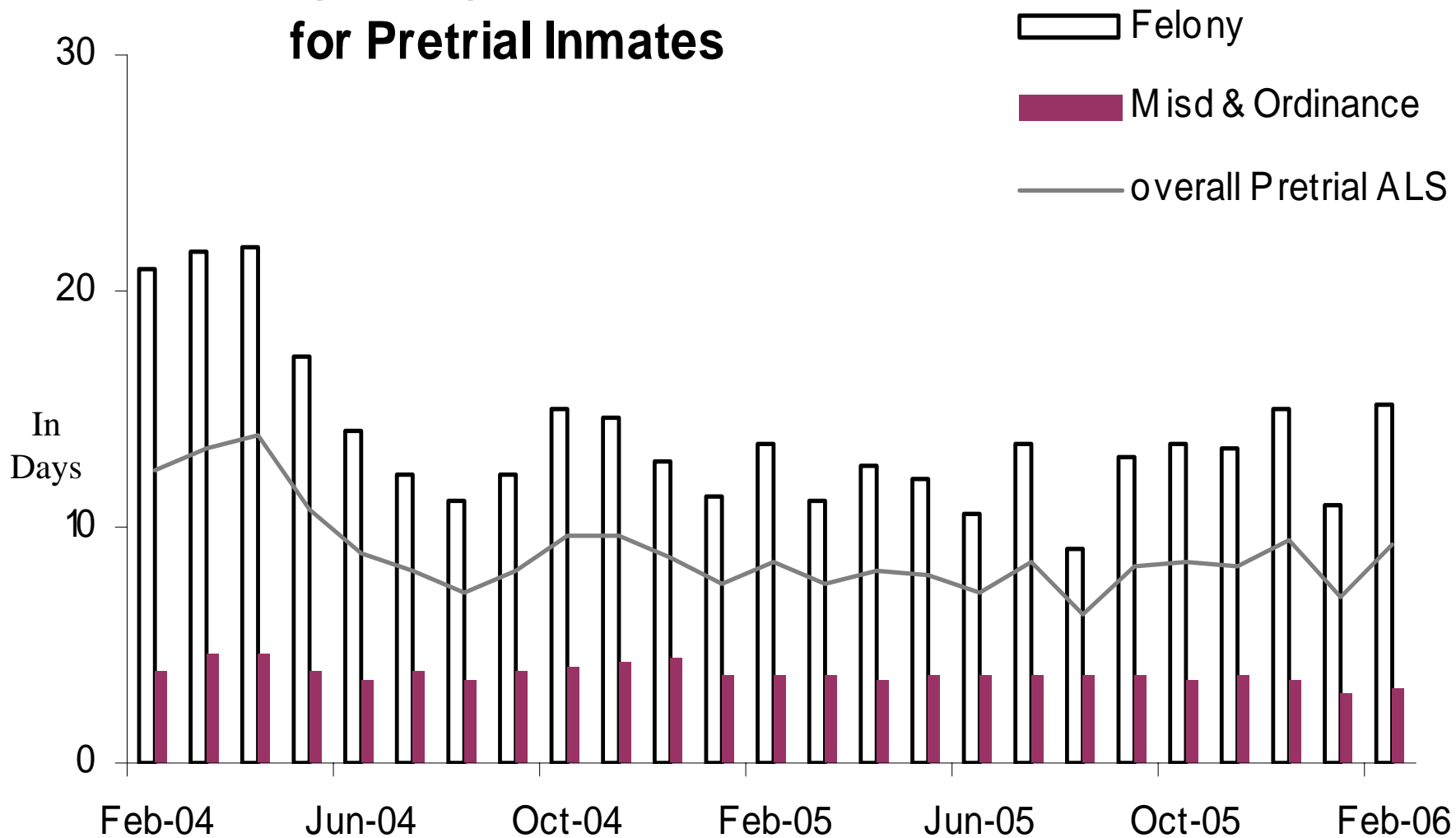

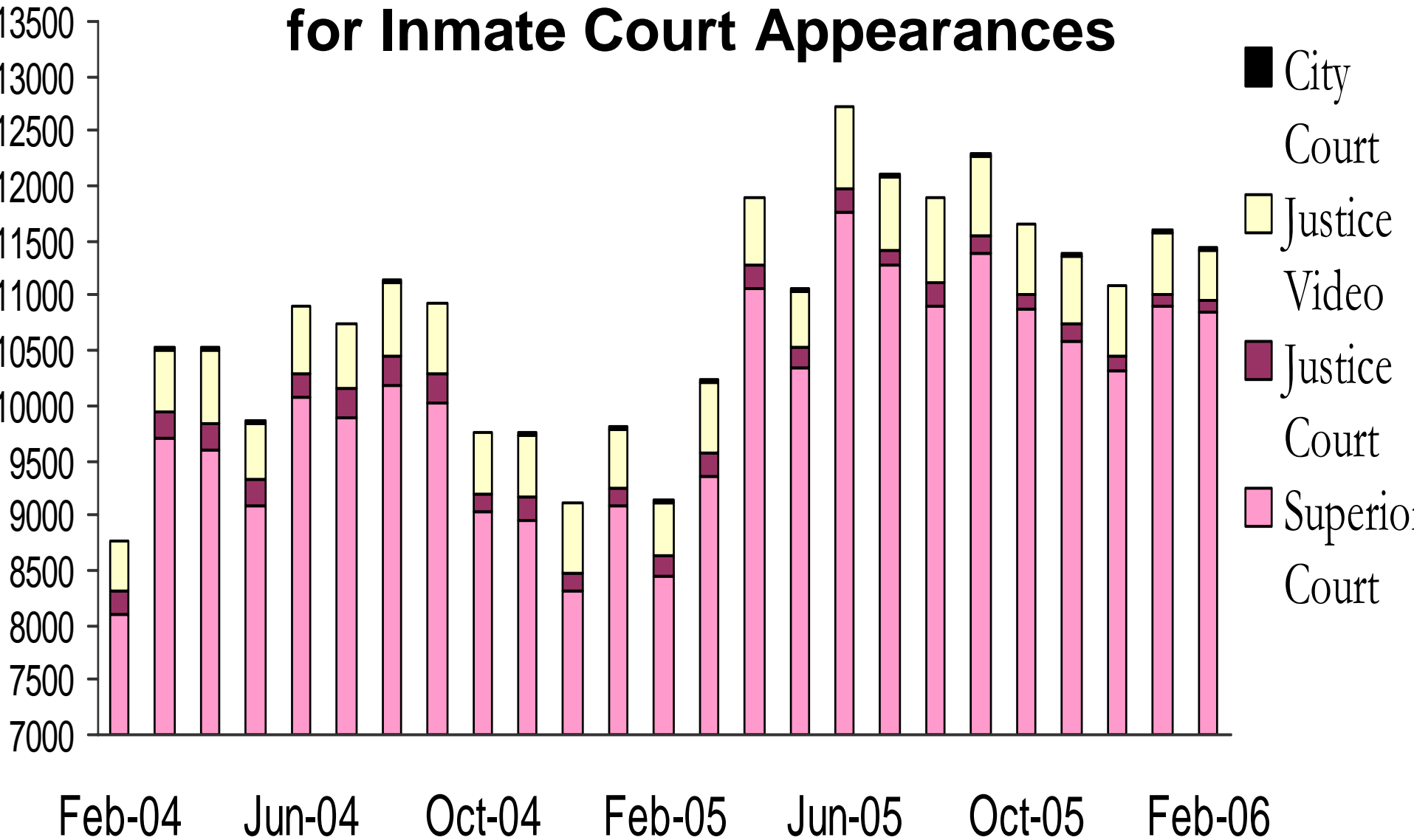
# Average Length of Stay in Jail Pretrial vs Sentenced Population

# Sheriff's Office Transports for Inmate Court Appearances

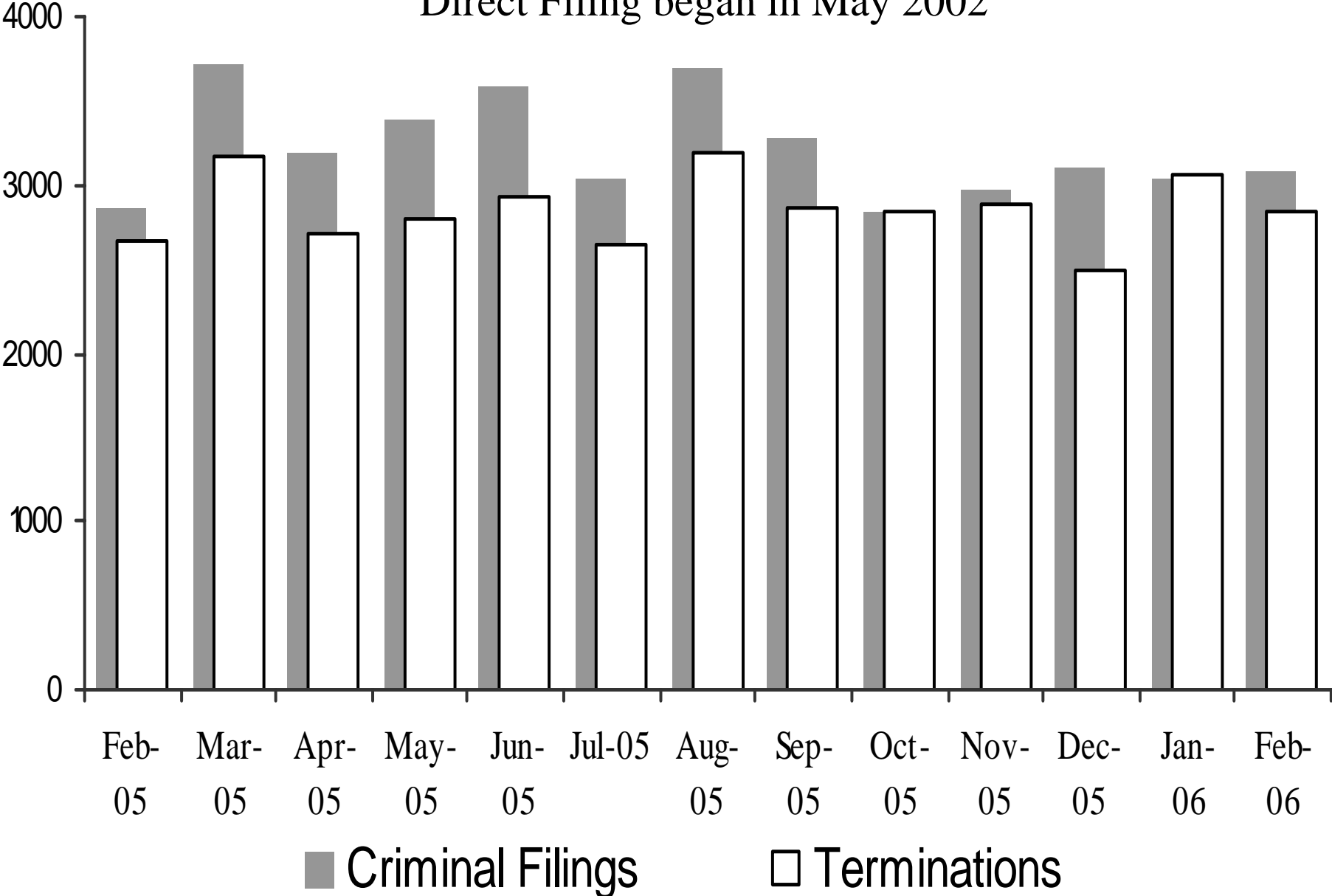


Since Direct Filing into Superior Court began May 2002, remaining transports to Justice Courts are for misdemeanor cases.

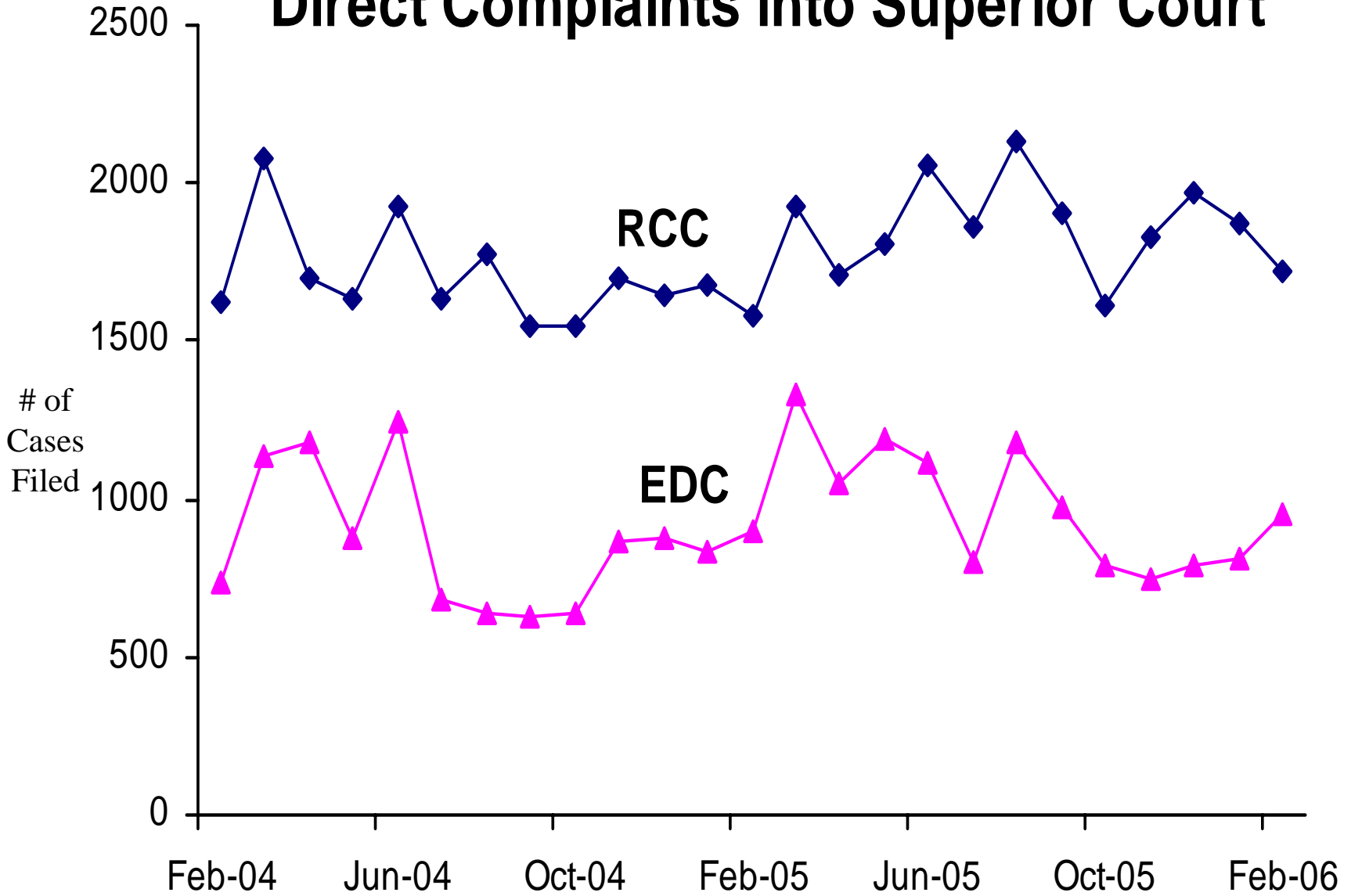


# Superior Court Filings and Terminations

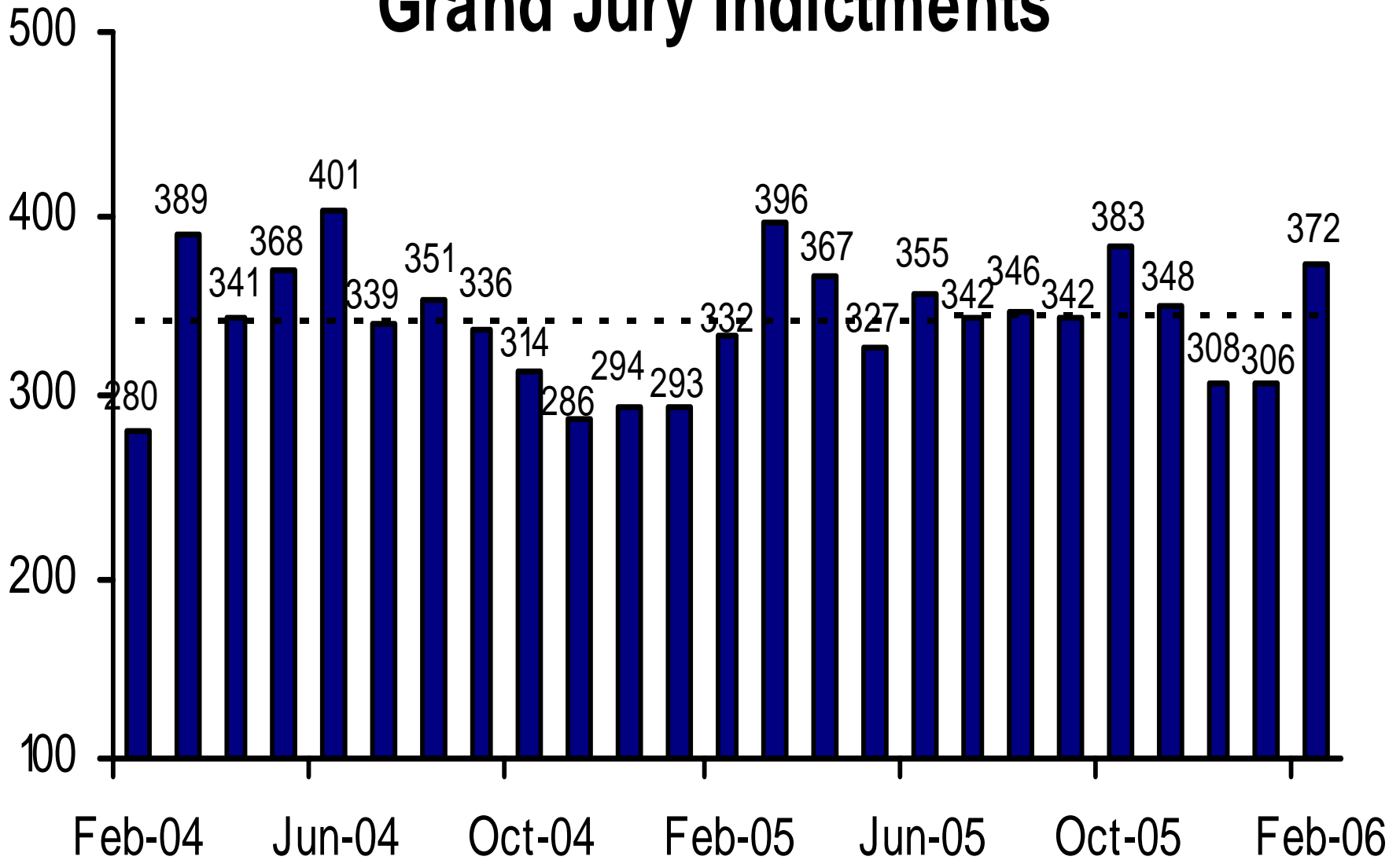
Direct Filing began in May 2002



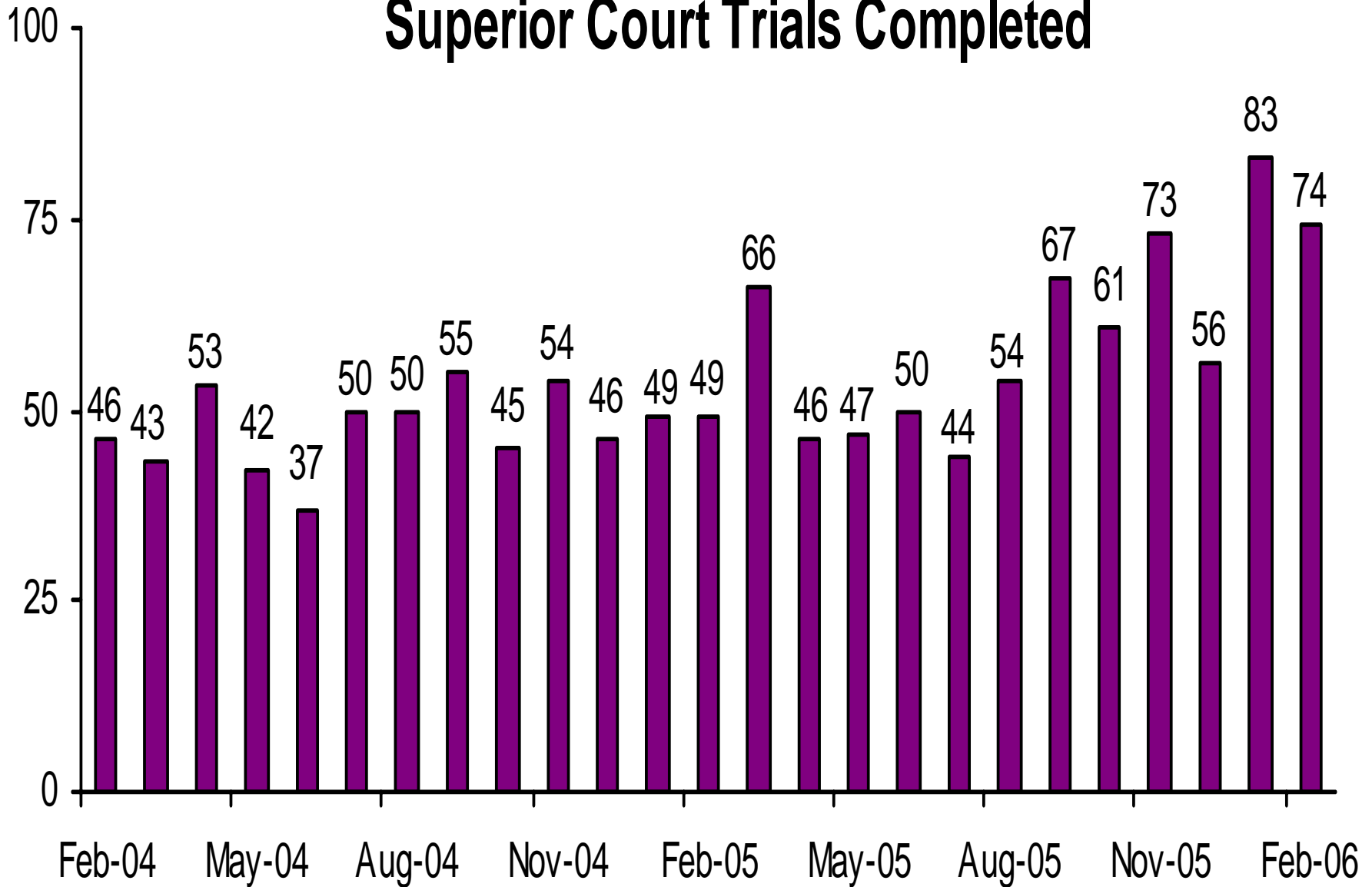
# Direct Complaints into Superior Court



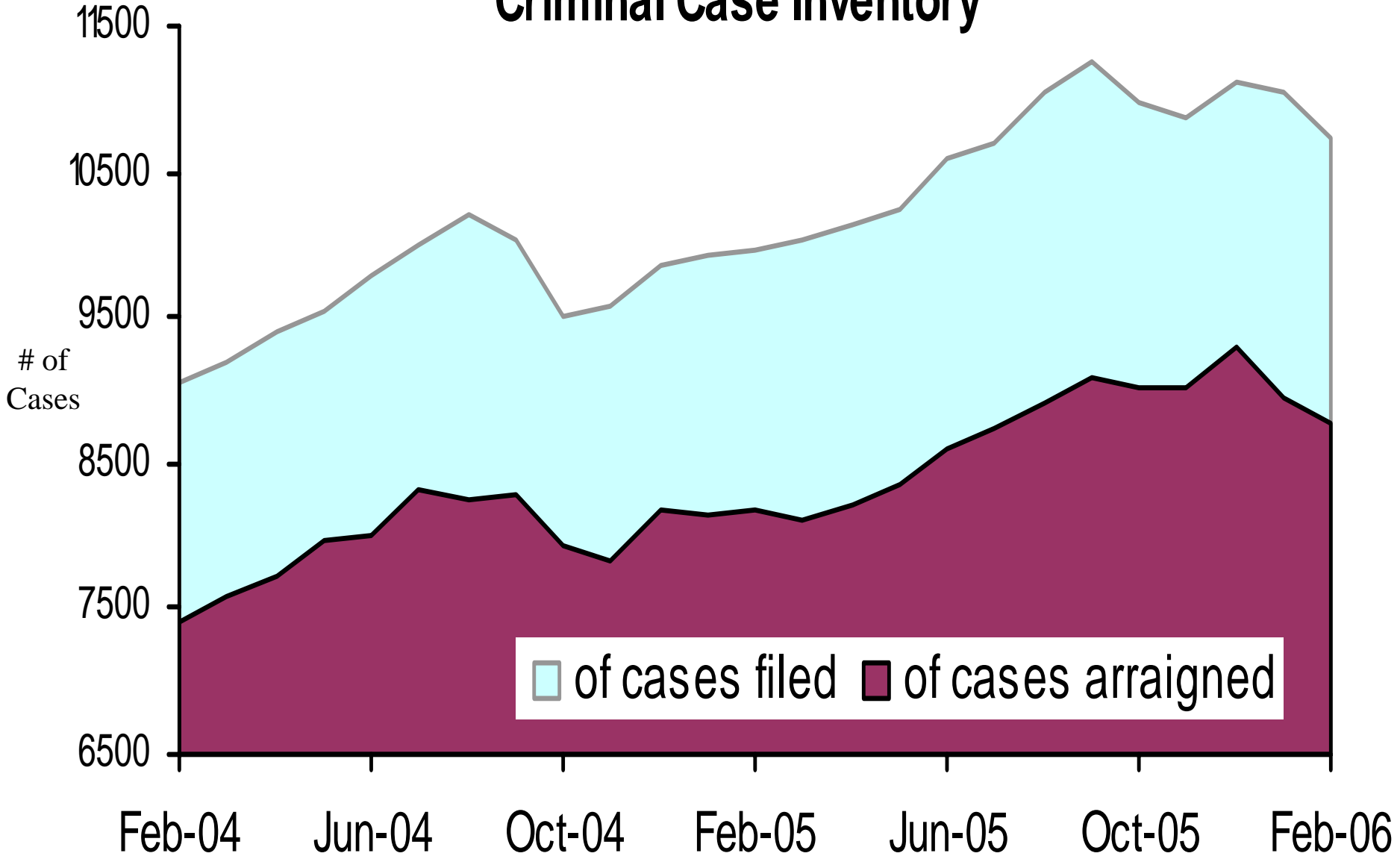

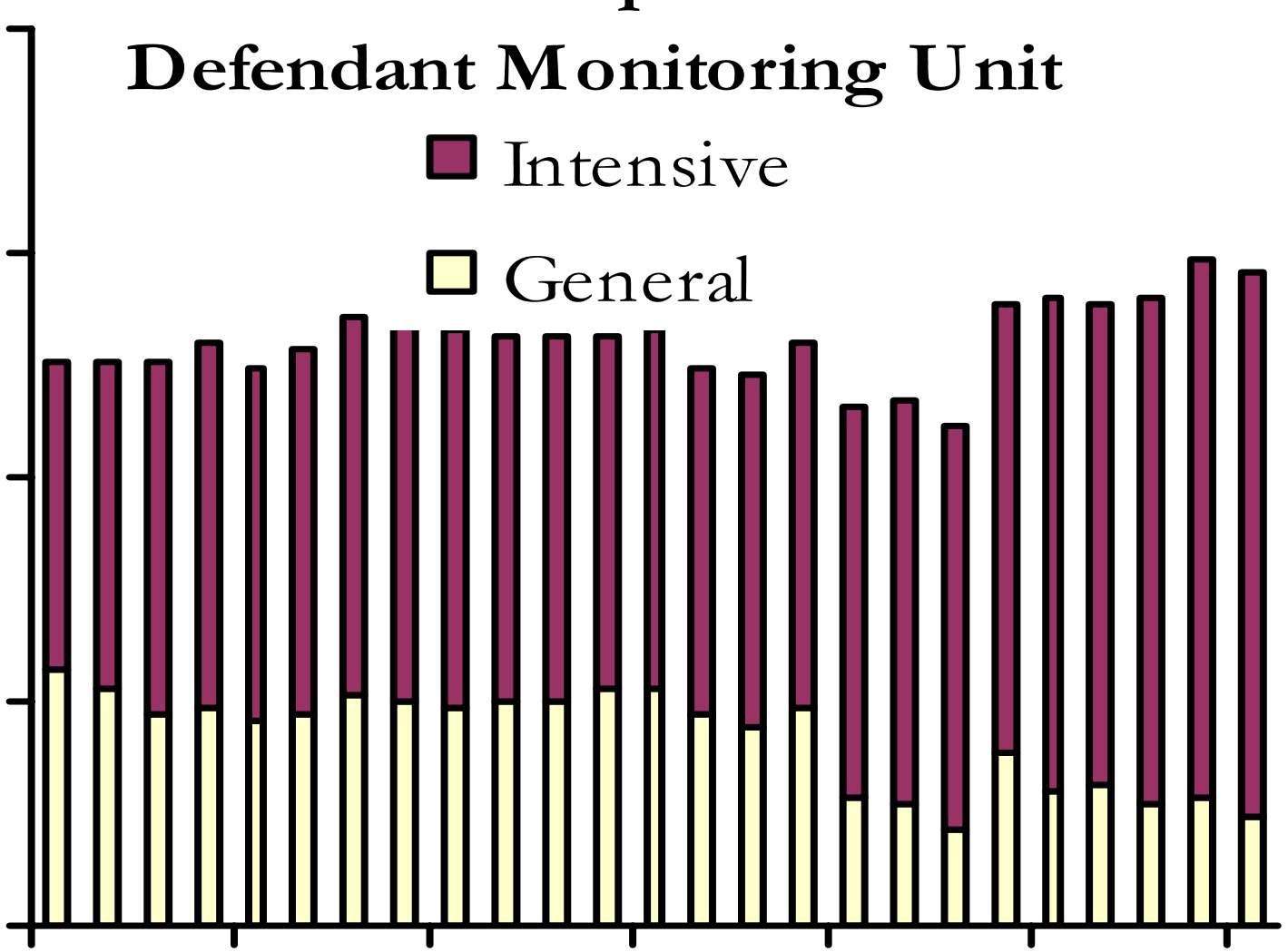

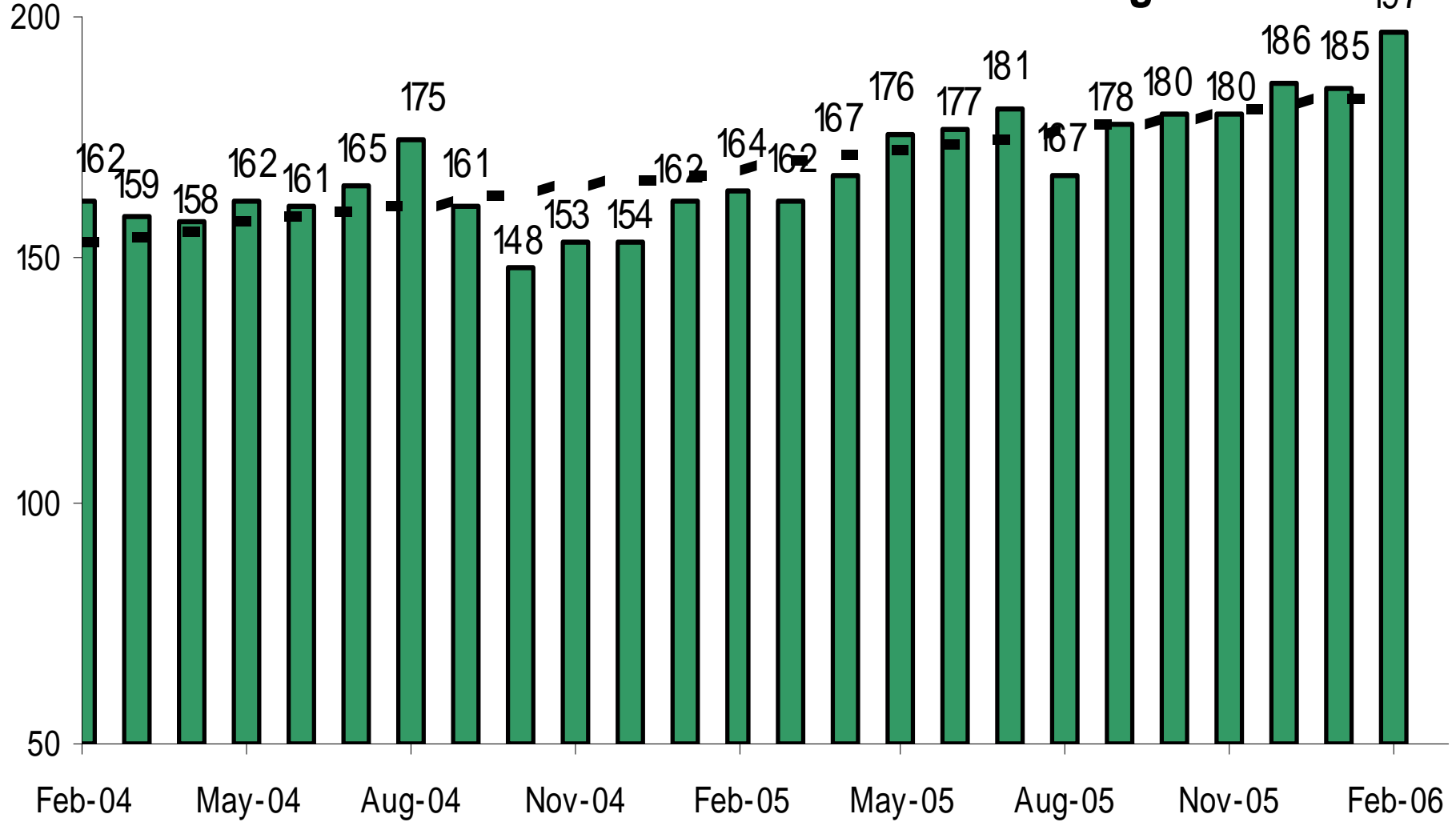

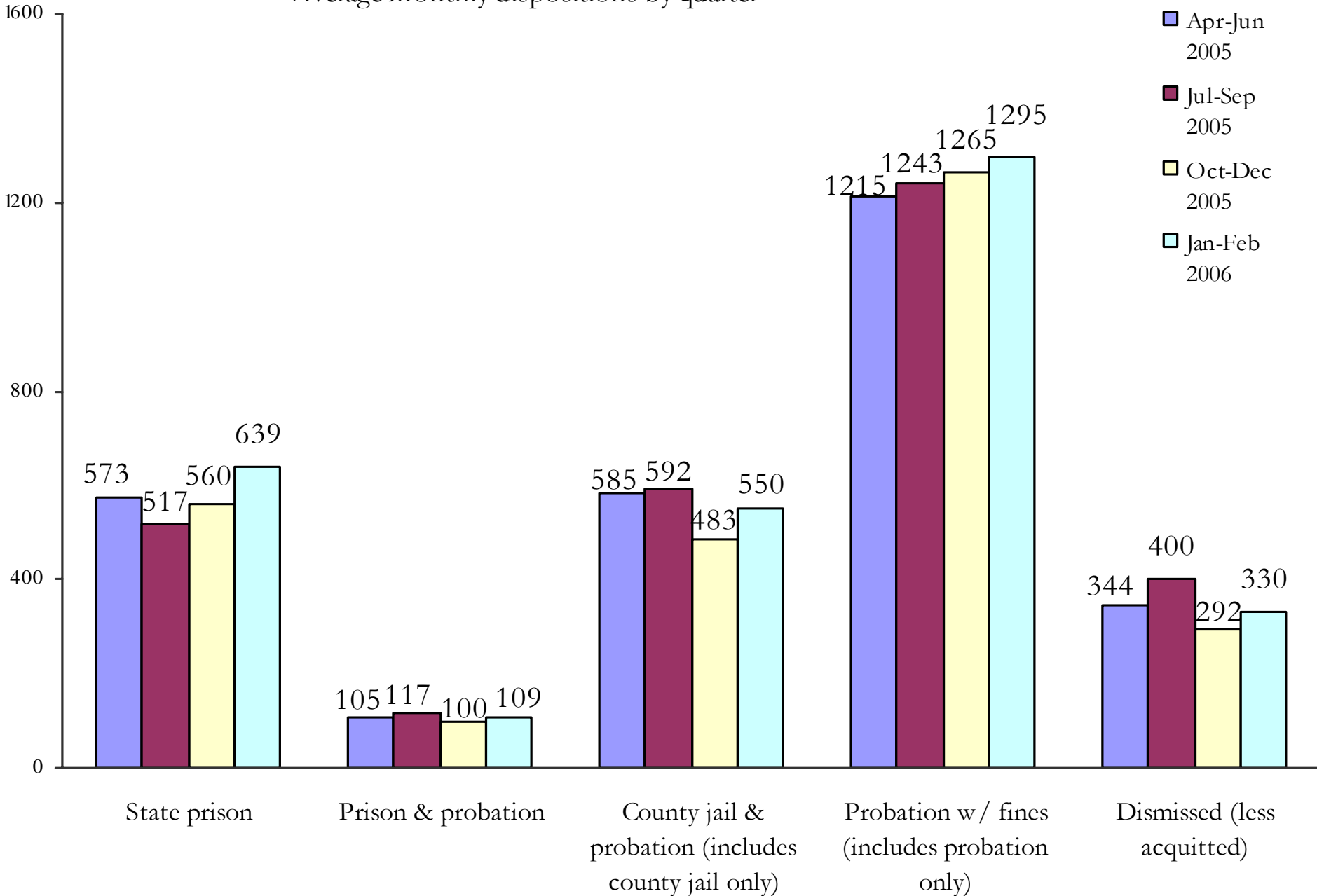
# Pretrial Supervision Defendants on Electronic Monitoring



# Disposition of Cases Terminated

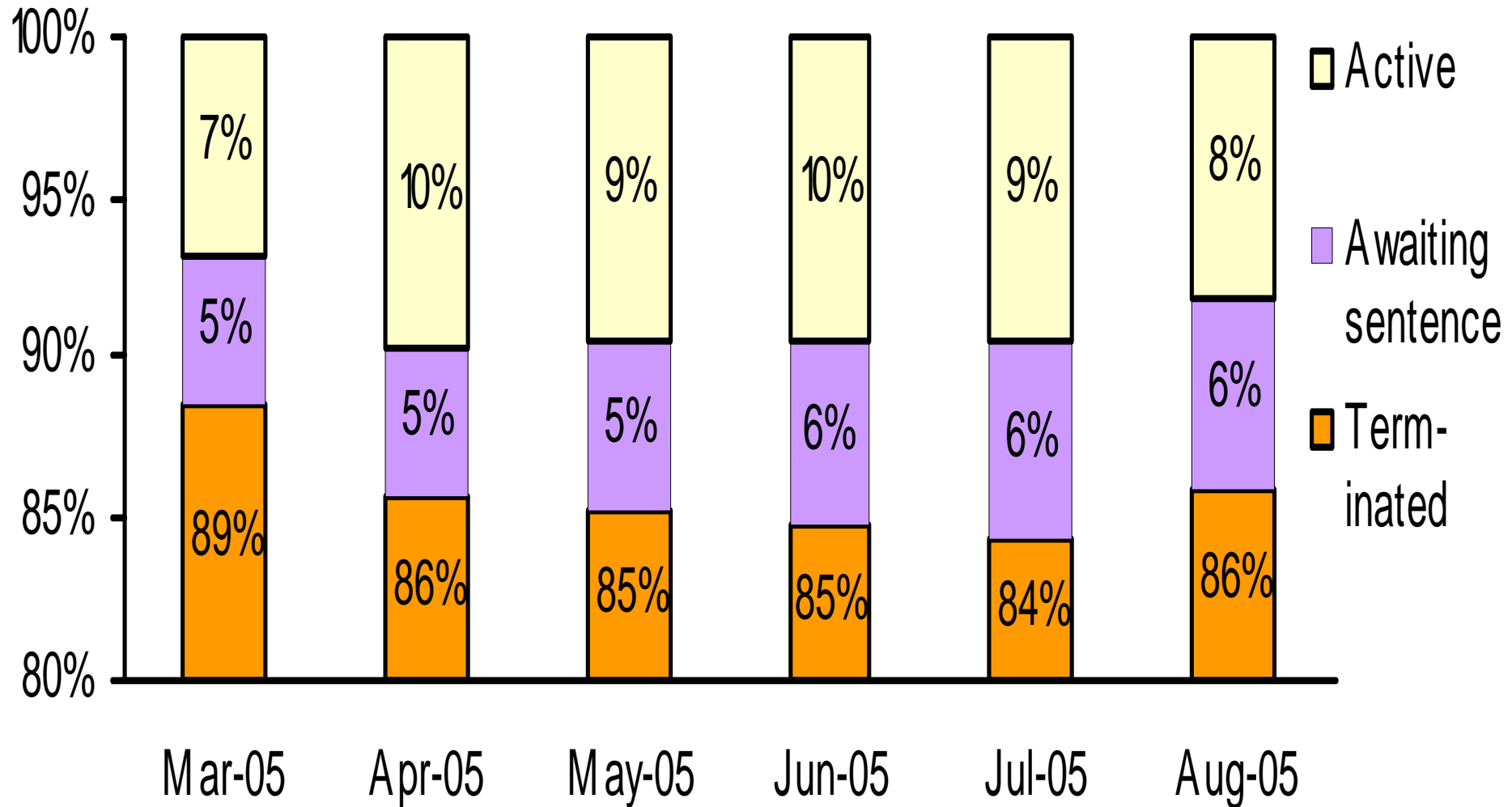
Average monthly dispositions by quarter

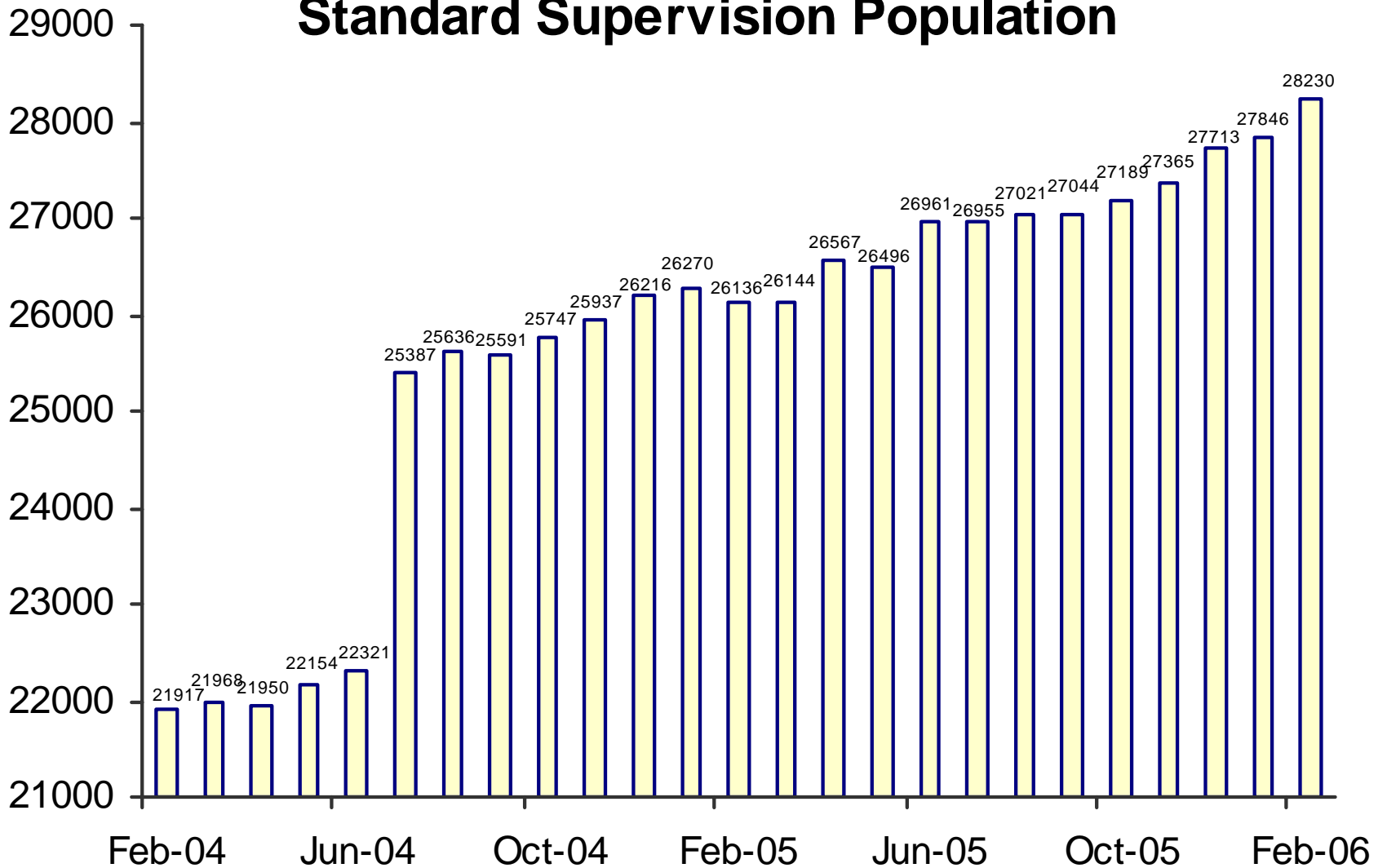




# Status of Cases After 180 Days

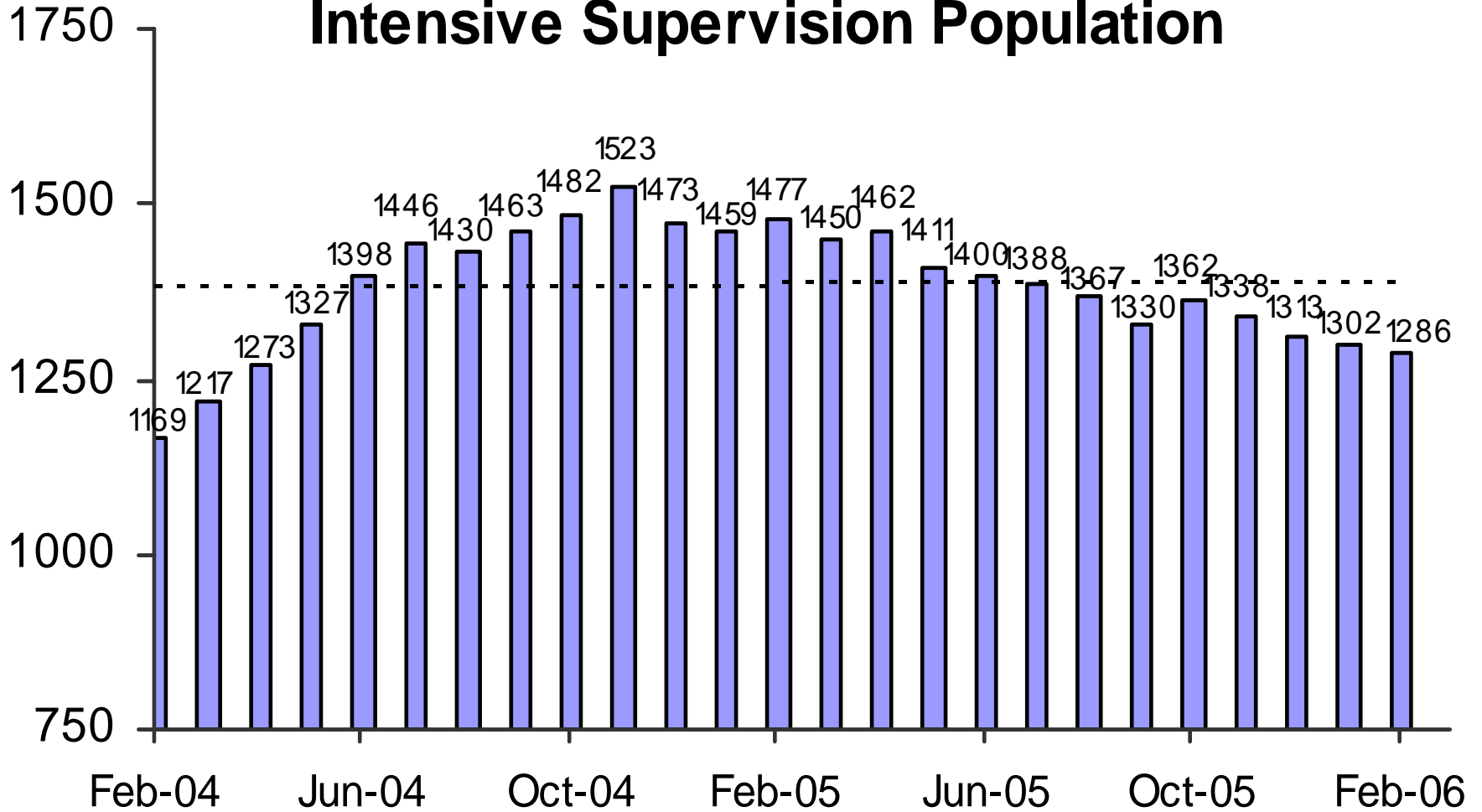


# Adult Probation Standard Supervision Population

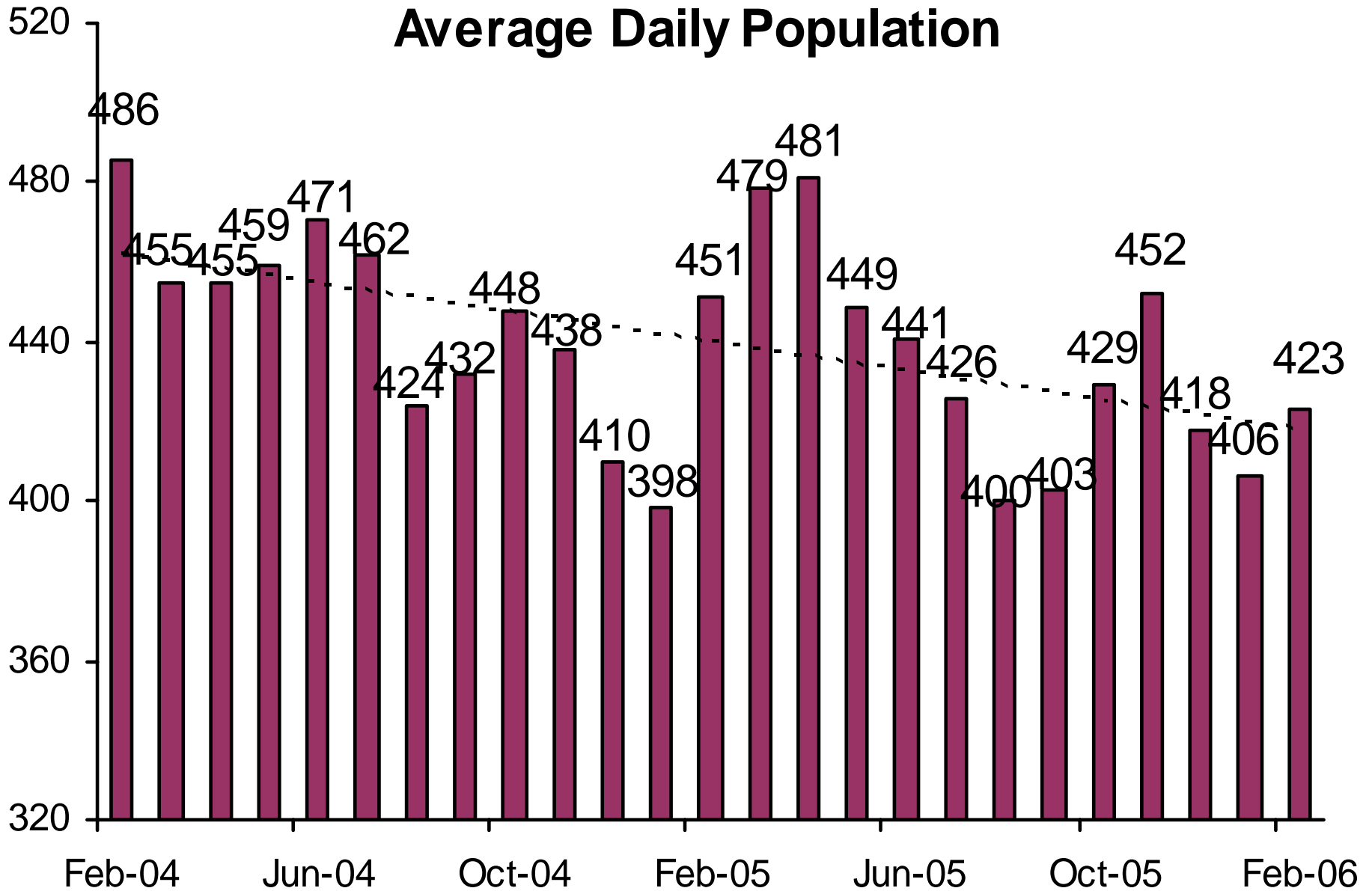


Interstate Compact and Report and Review caseloads are not included prior to July 2004. After July 2004, population as reported to the Board of Supervisors and JLBC is used.

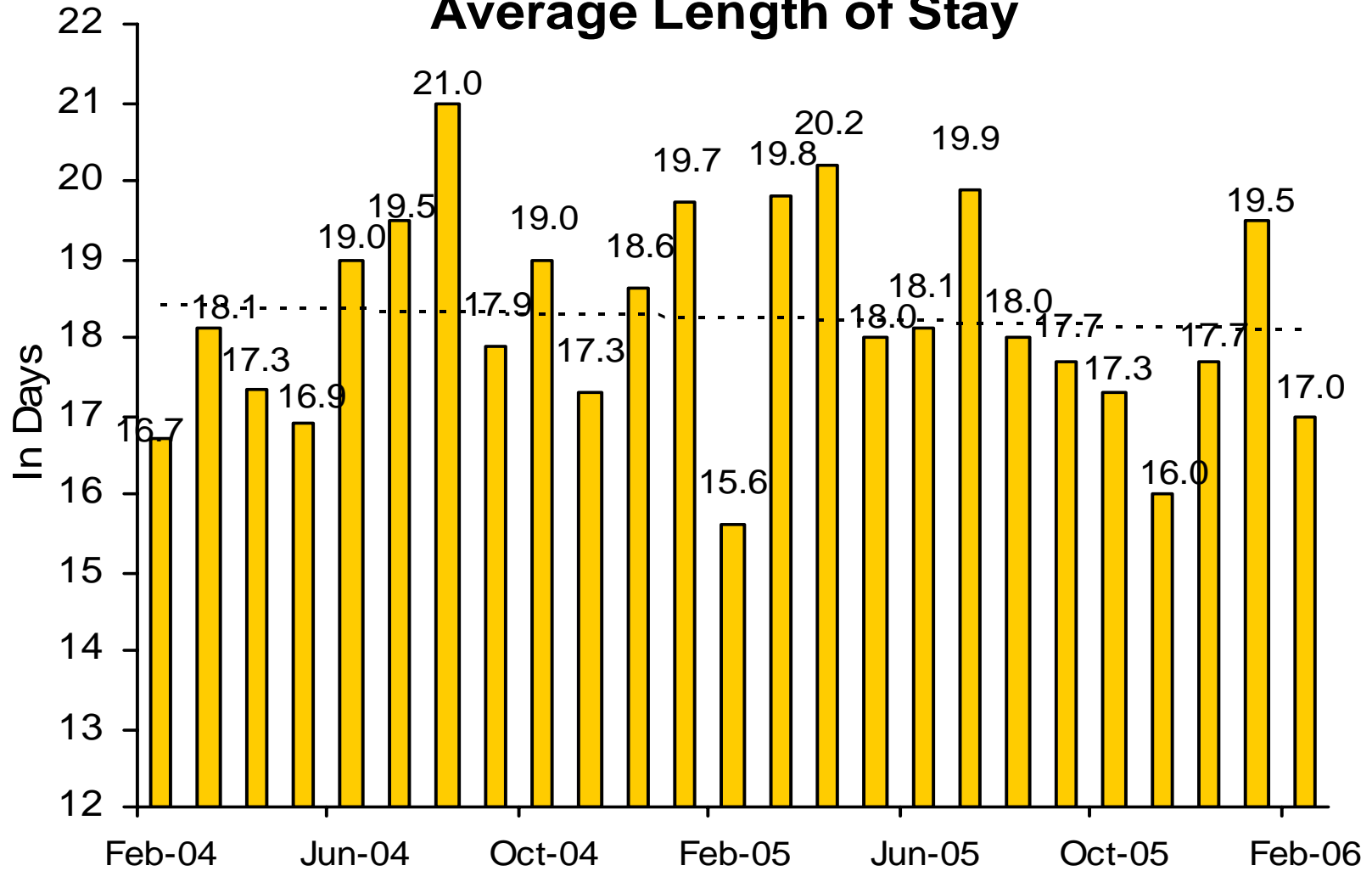
# Adult Probation Intensive Supervision Population



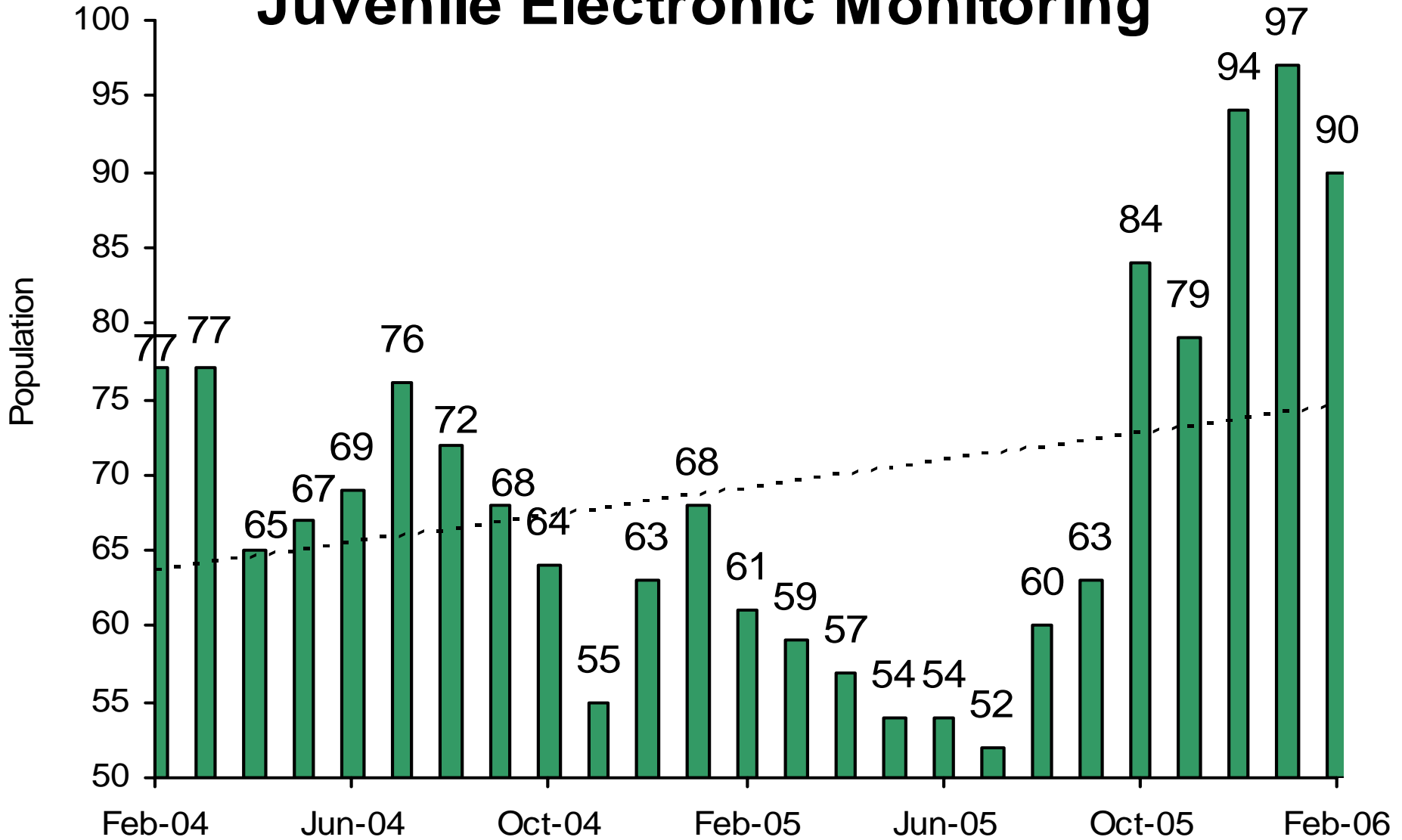
# Juvenile Detention Average Daily Population



# Juvenile Detention Average Length of Stay

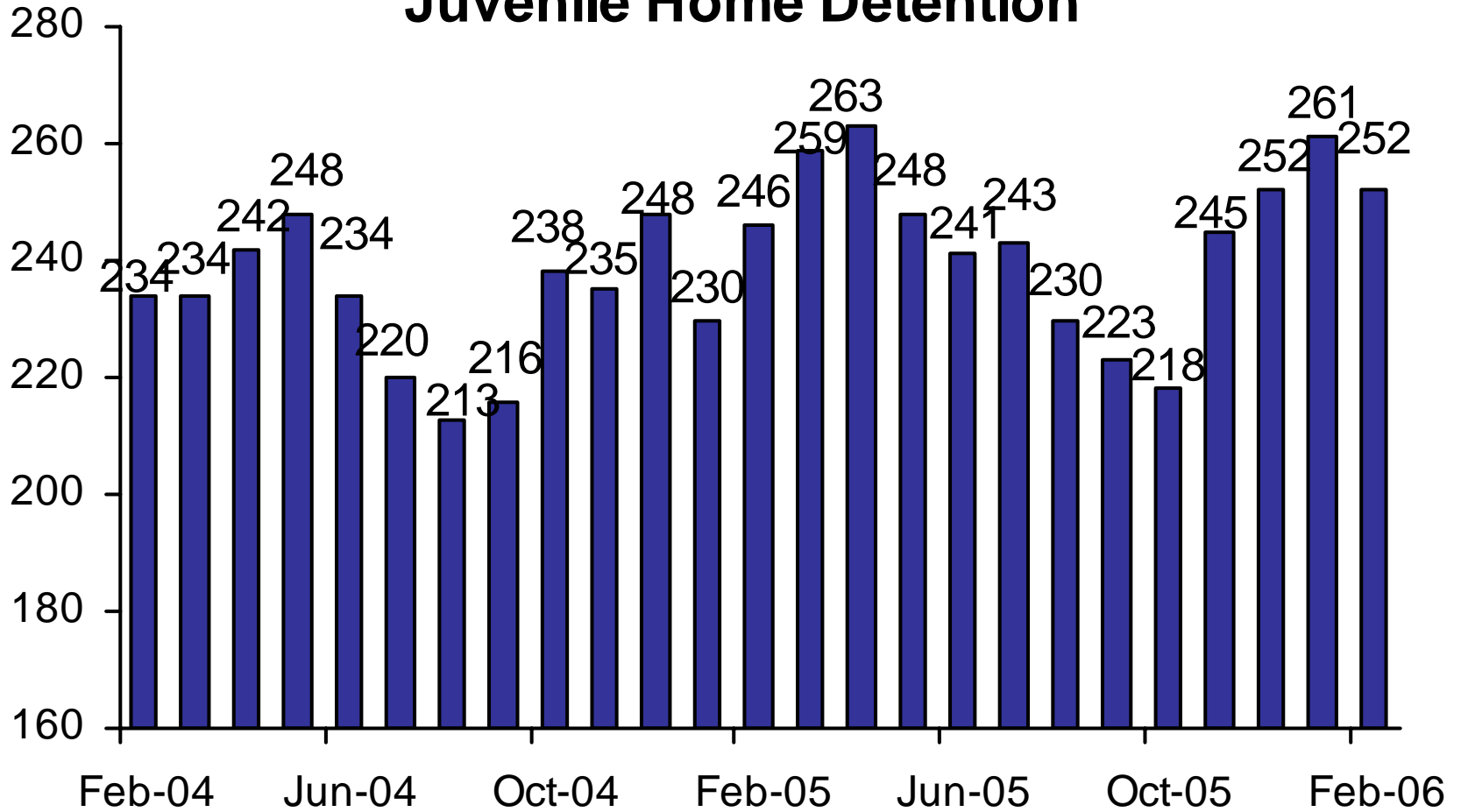


# Juvenile Electronic Monitoring
